MAY 1 CIVIC CLUB MEETING

Kathleen Ownby, SPARK Park director and Lauren Griffith, architect, are scheduled to speak at the May 1st Civic Club meeting. They will bring us up-to-date on the status of the new SPARK Park.

The park will include: a new playground area with play sets for different age groups consisting of a climbing structure, a playhouse; an outdoor theater area with a grassy slope for seating, a smaller track for bicycles/tricycles; and fitness/stretching stations. The walking track and baseball/soccer fields will remain.

So join us for the next Civic Club meeting on Tuesday, May 1st beginning at 7 p.m. Meeting will be held in the multipurpose building located on the north side of Garden Oaks Elementary School grounds at 901 Sue Barnett.

APPOINTMENT OF CARTER'S GROVE APARTMENT AD HOC COMMITTEE

At the April 3 Civic Club meeting I appointed an ad hoc committee whose purpose is to ensure that communication occurs between the City of Houston, City Council Member Toni Lawrence and Garden Oaks about the legal process and final disposition of the Carter's Grove property as it moves through the City of Houston's Forfeiture and Seizure Program.

As Garden Oaks residents, we have concerns about how the property is managed and maintained during this process because a vacant property that large (5.4 acres) in the middle of our neighborhood has the potential for new problems that could have an impact on all of us.

The ad hoc committee will seek answers to the following questions:

- 1. What happens next?
- 2. Will the buildings be demolished?
- 3. Will we have to live with vacant, abandoned buildings for some period of time?
- 4. Is there some chance that the owner (if he chooses to do so), could do repairs and such and get back the certificate of occupancy?
 Chairing the ad hoc committee is Gil Evans. Ad hoc committee members are Joanne Houck, Chris Lindsay, Laura Rahman, and Shelley Rogers.

Constable Program

Currently the community enjoys the services of a 40 hour week dedicated Deputy. In addition we have added support from the nearby Shepherd Park, Candlelight Plaza Deputy. A big thank you to those who have supported the program this year.... your house-holds are listed in this issue. Whether you have paid or not this program is there for all. Since the programs reinstatement over 2yrs ago, the crime statistics, as reviewed and compared by Citizen's Patrol Chair Carl Waters, revealed a 15% drop in incidents for the first year of the program. YES, THAT IS A 15% DROP the initial year and continued lower stats than when the program was not here! If you want to continue with lower crimes stats. your support is a must!

...Let's talk about the differences.... Response time.... and proactive policing... Due to the stretched manpower of HPD officers the response time is well over the quick response time of our own Deputy Constable or those that back up in Precinct One. Deputy Vest has been personally responsible for the removal of no less than 6 burglary suspects since his start here late summer '06. Due to a neighbor's quick call, Deputy Vest single handedly captured 3 juveniles after a break-in on Sue Barnett. Not only did he nab all 3 suspects following a neighborhood foot chase, but also later a fellow deputy at the home of the getaway driver, arrested the 4th suspect. In addition numerous parties have been removed from Garden Oaks streets for drug possession and open warrants for everything from assault to outstanding tickets. Our Deputy is proactive with suspicious persons, stopping them, running their info, and encouraging them to use the outskirts and not our neighborhood streets. Yes, drug offenders, a parolee for murder, and others have been on our streets. Simple checks of construction site workers let them know someone is watching. All of these folks talk amongst themselves letting others know an active officer is working our streets. Proactive policing in the school zones, speeding on West 43rd, and use of the Speed Radar trailer from Precinct one are all there to encourage slow down on our streets. During last falls rash of cat killings by dog packs, it was Precinct One's Deputies along with SPCA that resulted in trapping approximately 20 loose dogs from our area. A number were adopted and the aggressive breeds were handled. This was not the city; it was our own program that made a difference. Early morning checks of area Parks also keep or move homeless parties along. There

are a number of things the program does for all of us.

No Doubt the program works in a variety of ways, but your support is needed. Without you the program for our own personalized Deputy ends in September.

Another Mailer is on its way to remind those of you who may have forgotten. Also the form is attached here in the Gazette. If you do not see your household listed, please use the form on http://www.gardenoaks.org/Resources/ContributorForm.pdf.



Critters 101: Summer Shaving

When summer comes lots of folks want to have their dogs shaved to help them stay cooler. Expert recommendations vary on the topic of whether to clip a dog's coat. However, the ASPCA suggests for a double coated dog like a Chow trimming may help, but don't shave. Leave at least one inch to provide insulation and protection from sunburn. Longhaired dogs with a single coat like Border Collies should not be clipped as their coats may not be dense enough to protect them from the sun when short.

If you jog with your dog, do so in early morning or late evening and take water along. If it is over 85 degrees the dogs cannot cool themselves fast enough.

If your dog is outside put a fan out there with him, it will help cool him and keep the mosquitoes away. You can also wet you patio cement and as it evaporates it creates an air conditioning effect. Keep water bowls clean and full of fresh water. A slice of cold melon can cool and hydrate a hot dog.

Welcome:

President Sheila Briones called the meeting to order at 7:04 p.m. A motion was made and the March minutes were approved as they appeared in the Gazette.

Treasurer's Report:

Jerry Butler presented the current income and expense report and had detailed copies available at the meeting. He again reported that the Constable Program is low on funds.

Standing Committee Reports:

- Beautification: Brenda DeAlba reported the next work day is scheduled for Saturday, April 7 at Garden Oaks Blvd. New signs have been given to all the Park Captains to place in the parks to announce upcoming scheduled work days.
- Constable Program: Terry Jeanes encouraged members to take membership forms for the Constable Program to give to neighbors to increase enrollment in the program. The committee is preparing a mail out to send to Garden Oaks residents that are not members of the program. There will be another mail out to all members currently using the "bank draft option" notifying them of

a change in forms due to a change in the bank vendor. Constable David Vest again emphasized the importance of keeping vehicles locked, valuables out of sight, and parking closer to a residence. He encouraged residents to call the Constable's office if they see any suspicious activity. Terry Jeanes added a clarification on the Constables' hours: Deputy Vest works during the day and Deputy Martin's time overlaps and continues in to night. She stated that neighborhood crime statistics support the effect of having the Constable's Program in place.

- Gazette: Sue Schmidt and Jonathan Lanz were not present. Sheila reminded everyone of the 15th of the month deadline for Gazette articles.
- Garden Oaks Citizen Patrol: Carl Waters announced there were 12 reported crimes for the month of February: 7 were related to motor vehicles, 3 homes burglarized, one assault and one robbery. Carl reported 21 crimes to date for the year 2007. He encouraged more residents age 18 or older to volunteer for patrol.
- Website: Joe Muscara had no report. Sheila Briones thanked Joe for his efficiency and hard work on the

Garden Oaks website.

- Membership: Dian Austin was not present. Sheila reported for Dian that we have 305 paid members. She also reported on the "Garden Oaks Meet and Greet" that took place Thursday, March 22 at the Rainbow Lodge. The event was enjoyed by many with over 75 residents in attendance. The committee is looking for locations and ideas for future "Meet and Greets" so if you have any ideas please contact Dian Austin or Sheila Briones. Ivan Mayers was the winner of the Home Depot \$25 gift certificate raffle drawing.
- Garden Club: Brenda De Alba announced that Garden Club meetings are now being held on the 3rd Thursday of every month and not the 2nd Thursday as reported in the Gazette.





In the rain, the children stood by their booths selling their produce to Houstonians interested in local vegetables, fruits and other yummies. The day featured activities designed for children of all ages and gave them the opportunity to see where their food really comes from. Kidfriendly activities included seed planting, face painting, and coloring Easter Eggs with natural dyes like spinach, citrus and teas. Baby chicks to hold and ducks and rabbits to see all made the morning fun as they learned more about farming.

GOES thanks Urban Harvest and the Houston Garden Club for its support and the enrichment they are providing in our neighborhood. It's worth a trip to the market if you have not been. Located on Saturday mornings from 8:00 a.m. till noon at 3000 Richmond, the Bayou City Farmers' Market provides a venue for over twenty-five local vendors to sell their products directly to the public. The offerings include vegetables, fruits, pastured eggs, goats' milk and goats' milk cheeses, grass-fed beef and lamb, honey and beeswax products, fair trade organic coffee, prepared foods and baked goods, healthy

snacks, gourmet dog treats, fresh flowers, fresh herbs, and more. All of the produce offered for sale at the farmers' market is grown or produced in southeast Texas and is sold to consumers directly by the people that produce it. Shopping at a farmers' market is an excellent way to buy the freshest and most flavorful produce possible. Also, many of the products offered for sale at the market are produced without pesticides or in an environmentally friendly way; some are organically produced. Central City Co-op is another great resource in our city.

Other current activities happening at GOES are the Spring Festival April 20th and Movie Night Friday May 4th. We also are recognizing our great staff and teachers during Teacher Appreciation week May 1st. The last day of school is May 24th.
