Attacks on Our Elderly Neighbors

Please be aware that there have been two attacks on elderly neighbors in just the past month. One happened right here in Garden Oaks and the other in another neighborhood close to Garden Oaks.

In the Garden Oaks incident, a 90-year-

old female neighbor was attacked in her own driveway. She had just returned home, around 12:30 p.m. from a trip to the Kroger on W. 43rd when it happened. She was jumped as she walked up her driveway with armloads of groceries.

The attacker got away with her purse. The Houston Police Department is investigating at least six other similar attacks.

Channel 13, in one of their last postings on their web site, reported that investigators say that they have somebody under arrest who may be the suspect in this string of elderly attacks. Police won't say if the person in custody has been charged with these specific crimes.

Please, please, please keep an open eye on your neighbors and call the constable immediately at **713-755-7628** if you see anything suspicious or out of the ordinary.

GOMO Notes Ed de Alba

Annual Meeting to be held October 17th at 7:00 PM in the Garden Oaks Elementary School Cafeteria.

On Wednesday October 17th GOMO will hold its annual meeting in the Garden Oaks Elementary School's Cafeteria. The meeting will begin at 7:00 PM. The business to be transacted includes the election of several directors, the spending of surplus funds, and a modification of the Bylaws.

Director Positions Open

Section 1

The term of the position currently held by Graham Gips ends on October 31st. Graham was elected as an interim director when Sheila Briones resigned her seat to become Civic Club President. The term for this position runs through October of 2010.

Section 2

All 3 director positions are open in Section 2. The terms for the seats held by Jay Tatum and Ed de Alba end as of October 31st. Both Jay and Ed were elected in 2004. The terms for these 2 positions will be staggered with one to run through October 2009 and the other through October 2010.

Todd Prince, elected in 2005, is resigning his seat as of August 31st. The term for this position runs through October 2008.

Sections 3 & 5

No positions are currently open in either Sections 3 or 5.

If you are interested in running for any of the positions available in Sections 1 or 2, please contact any of the GOMO Directors listed in the Gazette.

The requirements of the positions are:

Must be 18 years or older

• Must own property and live within the Garden Oaks section for the Director's position that you are volunteering to stand election for

- If no Member residing in the Section stands for election, then a Member who is an owner in that Section, but lives in another Section, may stand for election as a "Non-Section Director", whose term is 1 year
- All property owned in Garden Oaks must be in compliance with the Garden Oaks Deed Restrictions, excluding violations that existed before your ownership of the property Must sign a statement attesting to the above

Surplus Funds

GOMO proposes two expenditures:

To add an additional daytime constable patrol of Garden Oaks, 40 hours per week for the period January 1, 2008 until December 31, 2008. This supplements the current daytime patrol already provided by the Garden Oaks Civic Club. Garden Oaks Maintenance Organization will pay for the service and the Garden Oaks Civic Club will be in charge of scheduling. Anticipated cost is \$65,000 for the year.

To extend the current nighttime constable patrol of Garden Oaks, 40 hours per week for the period August 1, 2008 until December 31, 2008. This will bring all the contracts for our patrols into step. Garden Oaks Maintenance Organization will pay for the service and the Garden Oaks Civic Club will be in charge of scheduling. Anticipated cost is \$27,000.

Bylaw Changes

Currently there is a disparity in the Bylaws relating to the period of time a proxy is valid.

Paragraph 3.08 currently reads, "At any meeting of its Members, the Member(s) representing a Parcel entitled to vote may vote by proxy executed in writing by the Member or by his or hers duly authorized attorney-in-fact. No proxy will be valid after 11 months from the date of its execution, unless other wise provided in the proxy."

Paragraph 2.02 (paragraph 5) reads, "Proxies may not be effective for a period exceeding 11 months." GOMO proposes a modification of the Bylaws: To delete the last 6 words in Paragraph 3.08, "unless other wise provided in the proxy".

This will bring the paragraphs into agreement and also bring the time period that proxies are valid into agreement with Texas State law.

Signs

GOMO has replaced two community signs that were hit by cars. The first at 43rd and Ella, the second at Ashland and 610. GOMO originally purchased signs for Garden Oaks and will continue to maintain and repair them as required.

An Open Invitation to our Meetings

We would like to personally invite all GOMO Members to all of our meetings. Democracy works best in an open environment and that is as true at the neighborhood level as it is at the Federal and State levels. There is no better way for the people of our community to see for themselves how we evaluate the building plans brought to us and how we reach consensus.

It is also the best way to get your questions answered. The GOMO Board is made up of 12 people and the Board doesn't have an "opinion" about a topic unless a majority of a quorum forms a consensus view. So no one Board Member is able to tell you what GOMO "thinks" about an issue or idea until we have an opportunity to deliberate and form a collective opinion. The formation of GOMO policy and opinion takes place every third Wednesday of the month at our business meeting held at the GOMO Office, 7:00 PM, Garden Oaks Professional Building, 4001 N. Shepherd, Suite 216. You are very welcome to attend, make suggestions, propose ideas, ask questions, clarify rumors, or simply observe the process.



Garden Club to Host Plant Swap

The annual Garden Oaks Garden Club Plant Swap is an informal event for gardeners new and experienced alike. It's a chance to trade extras from your garden for goodies that others want to share. Above all, it's the perfect way to obtain free plants in exchange for some of your garden excess. The fun and festivities will take place at 7:00 PM on Thursday, October 11th when we gather at the Rick Englert SPARK Park on the corner of Sue Barnett and W. 41st St.

To trade, bring anything that you think another gardener might want. This includes mature plants, divisions, or seedlings of perennials, annuals, vegetables or herbs; rooted and unrooted cuttings, bulbs and such, shrubs and trees, seeds, and houseplants. You can bring several of the same plant or several different items or even just one item. Don't overlook any garden tools, pots, books, and so on that you no longer want. Just be sure that your plants are labeled clearly with at least the common name, color of bloom, and light requirements. Be sure to bring an extra box or flat for taking home your new treasures. Please don't bring anything to sell.

Our plant swaps are not the most organized events and I guess that's the way we like it. Folks come to the swap with plants they don't have the nerve or desire to throw away or plants they want to share. We're here to help them deal with their guilt and to give them the deadline or motivation they were looking for to dig things up and change things around. Maybe the plants have outlived their usefulness. Maybe they took over a corner (that can happen!) or they didn't fit into a color scheme or "they just never did anything for me."

This will be a "buffet-style" swap. You will be asked to sort your goodies according to category (flowers for shade, flowers for sun, shrubs and trees, vegetables and herbs, houseplants, etc.). After a brief description of what is available, the swap will begin. During each round, we will help ourselves to one plant each until everything is gone. This is not a money event. Nothing costs anything. It's about having a little too much of this and not enough of that. It's not scientific, although every once in a while we get someone who is 100 percent certain about the botanical name of a plant (we like that!). It's just an informal way to exchange information, seeds and stories. It's a great way to come across oldfashioned plants we can't find in catalogues or plant stores.

Garden Club meetings are open to all residents and friends of Garden Oaks. If you would like to become a member of the Garden Club, annual dues are only \$25.00. For more information about the Garden Oak's Garden Club you may call club President Chris Lindsay at (713) 819-8412. We meet the 3rd Thursday of every month at 7:00 pm. (with the exception of this meeting which will be held on the 2nd Thursday of the month). Most meetings take place in the Garden Oaks Professional Building, 4001 N. Shepherd, Suite 216, which is the GOMO office. Each meeting typically features a guest speaker followed by a brief business meeting. In addition, the Garden Club is responsible for the maintenance of Friendship Garden and we conduct 2 workdays (spring and fall) when we add new plantings, replace the mulch and tidy up the beds. If you would like to participate in our plant swap, we invite you to visit with us at 7:00 pm on Thursday, October 11th when we meet at Rick Englert SPARK Park.
