According to the HPD Website there were only two, yes two, crimes reported in the neighborhood for the month of September. For the year this means there have been 55 crimes reported in the neighborhood compared to 81 for the time frame last year. So when you see an HPD Officer or one of our Constables driving in the neighborhood shout out a big thank you and if you haven't already done so, send a check to the Civic Club to keep the Constable Program running.

Here are a few crime prevention tips to keep your holiday season safe:

- Keep the outside of your home well lit.
- Lock your doors and keep the curtains drawn.
- If you display gifts beneath the Christmas tree, do so in a manner where they are not visible from outside.
- Cut up gift boxes and put them in nontransparent trash bags to avoid advertising all those wonderful presents you received.

President James Flowers called the meeting to order at 7:02 pm. A motion was made and seconded to accept the September minutes as they appeared in the *Gazette*.

Treasurer's Report:

Jerry Butler presented the 2009 Garden Oaks Civic Club budget. A motion was made, seconded and carried to accept the 2009 budget. Jerry also presented a current income and expense report for the Civic Club and had detailed copies available at the meeting. He encouraged those that haven't yet paid their membership for the Constable Program to pay their 2009 dues.

Standing Committee Reports:

Beautification: Brenda DeAlba asked residents to support the GOMO proposal to provide funds for maintenance and landscaping of neighborhood green spaces. The proposal will be voted on at the November 12, 2008 annual GOMO meeting.

Constable Program: Terry Jeanes announced the Constables' contracts for 2009 have an increase in pay of 3%. The membership mail-out is about half way completed.

Top Ten Reasons for Civic Club Involvement

By now you should have received your personal invitation to support both the Garden Oaks Civic Club and the Constable Program for 2009. Why not make it your New Year's resolution to participate and lend your support?

The Garden Oaks Civic Club exists for the purpose of providing a forum for residents to learn more about local initiatives, problem-solve and become more cohesive as a neighborhood. Membership is open to anyone who lives in the neighborhood regardless of whether they own or rent their home. For 2008, we had just 324 paid civic club memberships out of some 1400+ homes, a support rate of about 23%. A far smaller percentage of residents attend the monthly meetings and while this has been the norm for the past several years, we need to get more people involved!

The meetings are held on the first Tuesday of each month at Garden Oaks Elementary School and generally last about an hour. During 2008, we provided the forum to learn more about:

- The Garden Oaks Condominiums (formerly Carters Grove apartments).
- Plans for the empty Conn's building in Sect.1.
- The City of Houston's 3-1-1 line.

Officer CJ Mangano and Lieutenant Kovar discussed reports by residents of being approached by a young man for either work or handouts. They encouraged residents to report any suspicious activity. Recognition and thanks were given to the officers present and to the other Precinct One officers for their help and support during the days following Hurricane Ike.

Gazette: Jessica Jarvis had no report. Recognition with applause was given to Jessica to show the appreciation for the work she has done since taking over as Editor.

Garden Oaks Citizen's Patrol: Carl Waters reported that the neighborhood had 2 DWI's arrests for the month of September.

Membership: Brenda DeAlba won the raffle, receiving a \$25 gift certificate for Lowes. There was no call for an inquiry, even though her husband, Ed, pulled the winning ticket.

GOMO Notes

Annual Meeting Held November 12th.

The GOMO annual meeting was held Wednesday, Nov 12th. The business transacted included the election of several directors and the voting on the spending of surplus funds.

New Directors Elected

The directors for Sections 1, 2 and 3 were elected by acclamation. Sheila Briones is the new director for Section 1, her term runs through October of 2011. Adrian Berry was elected to represent Section 2 and his term also runs through October of 2011. In Section 3 all three directors are newly elected: Ivan Mayers to a one-year term, Kelly Mathews to a two-year term and Jerry Butler to a three-year term, with terms running through the ends of October 2009, 2010 and 2011 respectively.

In Section 5, we had the unusual situation where five individuals from the Section ran for two open positions. Tim Weltin was elected to the three-year term with 49 votes. Reagan Cracknell and Mitch Katine tied with 15 votes each so a coin toss decided the contest for the two-year term. Mitch called heads and won the election. Many thanks to Tom and Trish Mehrkam, who also participated in the election.

Surplus Funds Voted

All three funding measures passed. The first measure, the funding of one evening and one daytime Constable, and the second measure, funding for the maintenance of our greenspaces, passed 184 to 8. The third measure, refurbishment of the Graham Park tennis court and building of a practice back board also passed, 164 to 18.

Many Thanks to Retiring Directors

I want to thank the directors who recently completed their terms and chose to retire from the board. Mike Dishberger, Rich Stark and Malcolm Taylor all served several terms, some of them from the beginning of GOMO to the present, and Lynn Sievers, Jason Mercer and Sean Jez have completed their terms and are moving on. Many many people in the neighborhood have no idea of the efforts you have performed on their behalf and I give thanks to all of you for your service, your insight into some tough situations and for just being there.

An Open Invitation to our Meetings

We would like to personally invite all GOMO Members to all of our meetings. Democracy works best in an open environment and that is as true at the neighborhood level as it is at the Federal and State levels. There is no better way for the people of our community to see for themselves how we evaluate the building plans brought to us and how we reach consensus. It is also the best way to get your questions answered. The GOMO Board is made up of 12 people and the Board doesn't have an "opinion" about a topic unless a majority of a quorum forms a consensus view. So no one Board Member is able to tell you what GOMO "thinks" about an issue or idea until we have an opportunity to deliberate and form a collective opinion. The formation of GOMO policy and opinion takes place at 7pm, on every third Wednesday of the month at our business meeting held at the GOMO Office, Garden Oaks Professional Building, 4001 N. Shepherd, Suite 216. You are very welcome to attend, make suggestions, propose ideas, ask questions, clarify rumors or simply observe the process.

Recycling Opportunity

Thanks to all the neighbors who came by and picked up green recycling bins from my porch. That entire stash is now gone. I have talked with my contact in the Solid Waste Dept. and there are more green bins on backorder. I have asked for 20 more bins to be delivered to me, and will post an announcement on the listserv and in the *Gazette* when those bins arrive.

Meanwhile, our December recycling dates are Tuesday, December 9th and Tuesday, December 23rd.

On the subject of recycling, consider one of these options for your old cell phones: Both the Houston Area Women's Center and any Verizon Wireless storefront accept no-longer used wireless phones, batteries and accessories in any condition from any wireless service provider. Phones that can be refurbished are sold for reuse and those without value are disposed of in an environmentally sound way. Proceeds from the HopeLine program are used to provide wireless phones and cash grants to local shelters and non-profit organizations that focus on domestic violence prevention and awareness.

The Cell Phones For Soldiers Program collects similar no-longer-used wireless phones, batteries and accessories and turns those items into pre-paid phone cards for US soldiers (of all military branches) serving overseas. You can print off a free postage-paid mailing label by going to:

www.cellphonesforsoldiers.com. Then simply package the donated materials for mailing and drop it off at the post office. While neither program says it's mandatory, I generally delete all my personal info and contact lists from any phone that I donate.

Discovery Green is Houston's new 12 acre urban park in the heart of downtown. It is the result of a unique public-private partnership between the non-profit Discovery Green Conservancy and the City of Houston; the work of many talented architects, designers (including Lauren Griffith Associates who designed our original Spark Park and the Re-SPARK of our park here in Garden Oaks) artists and contractors. Each week Discovery Green hosts many activities that promote peace and activity for its visitors. The Green Market is one example.

Green Market is a project of Central City Co-Op, bringing Central City's produce and products to downtown Houston. Farmers use all organic practices and come within a 200 mile radius of Houston. In addition to shares, they have an open market featuring seasonal, organic vegetables and fruit. Prepared food vendors use a mix of organic and conventional ingredients and all are made in Houston. The craft and service vendors showcase unique product offerings of recycled materials, earth-friendly practices and local labor.

You can visit the Green Market each Thursday afternoon at Discovery Green and see vendors with an interest in Community. Recently, a new Community outreach project began to highlight Houston Non- Profit groups. Friends of Montessori was invited to be the "Non-Profit of the Week" featured at the Green Market on Thursday, November 6th and share the message of Public Montessori education in the Houston Independent School District. Friends of Montessori, which began in Garden Oaks, now makes an impact on almost 800 children ages 3 years to 7th grade.

If you have never visited the Green Market, please do so soon. You can pick up fresh, local produce, do some holiday shopping and enjoy some good local music in the park all 15 minutes away from home.

Critter Corner

HAPPY HOLIDAYS! Yep, we are full swing into the holidays and many people find this season very stressful. Did you know that it could also be a stressful time for your pets? Mau Mau and I have some tips for you to keep the stress down for your pets.

Critters 101: Holiday Stress

Although they needn't fret about finding the perfect gift for someone, pets – like people – may experience stress this holiday season. Routines are very important for a lot of our pets, especially cats and nothing disrupts routine more than the holiday season. Visitors in the home, busy schedules, re-arranged furniture or lack of attention may cause pets to engage in strange behaviors such as pacing, whining, clinging, excessive licking or hiding. Many pets exhibit stress with a loss of appetite and will stop eating. Pet owners should be on guard for these signs and take appropriate steps to prevent them.

Although it is difficult, your pets' routines should be maintained as much as possible during the holiday season. Feed your pets at their usual time, check the water bowl frequently, let your dogs out regularly and provide a comfortable, quiet place of refuge for your pets to retreat to if they need to escape the hustle and bustle around them.

Remember that poinsettias, holly berries and mistletoe are all toxic if ingested by your pets and that preservatives added to your Christmas tree's water can also be toxic if consumed. Tinsel, holiday ornaments and wrappings look like toys to your pet but can be hazardous. Kittens like to climb trees so be sure your Christmas tree is well anchored. Rich holiday foods, laden with sugar and fat can give your pets severe gastrointestinal complaints and goodies like chocolate, raisins and sugar-free gum are toxic and can even be fatal for your pets.

The holidays may be hectic, but make sure you spend quality time with your pets. Just by simply being together, you and your pet can reduce each other's stress, improve your moods and enhance each other's well being. Now, what could be a better holiday gift than that?




