CITIZENS' PATROL PROGRAM by Carl Waters, Jr.

The various message boards in and around the Garden Oaks community were a buzz with suspicious vehicle reports in late February and into March with some residents following suspicious vehicle to get license plates for the police and their neighbors. I applaud the effort, but ask everyone to use common sense and be safe in these endeavors. You don't know the person you are following. You don't know if he has a firearm and is prepared to use it on you because to him you are suspicious for following him. Get the basics and give the information to the authorities and let them handle tracking down the driver. What are the basics? Color, make and model of the vehicle, two door, four door, SUV, minivan, pickup truck. Tell the authorities what caught your attention (driving slowly, you have seen it several times, ladder on top and no business markings on the vehicle, etc.). If you can SAFELY get a plate number and/or a description of the driver or passengers GREAT, but

don't risk your life over it. Property can be replaced. YOU CAN'T. The program has received several applications for new members and several are in the process of being trained. We can still use more persons to continue the battle to keep the neighborhood safe.

I did a quick review of the HPD website, and it appears crime may be slowing down in the neighborhood. Through the 14th of March only one theft was listed on the HPD website. Here's hoping for a quiet spring.



There were eight crimes in January for a total of eighteen in the first two months of the year. The same timeframe in 2011 had three crimes. We need more eyes on the streets and more communication. If it does not look right, call the Constable. If you plan to be away, please tell your trusted neighbors and use the vacation watch. Know your lawn service. Do not use strangers to do any work. Be vigilant about solicitors. We have had some additional volunteers to help with the Patrol but we need more. We have 1500 homes and need more than 12 volunteers to help patrol our streets.

Constable Program: No update.

Membership: No update.

Beautification: Kimberly Horowitz reported that the green spaces have been cleaned up in the area near Sonic. Next projects include mulching and weeding before the Home Tour. Volunteers are needed to help pick up trash before the Home Tour.

Gazette: No update.

GardenOaks.org Website: Joe Muscara reported that the website has been updated with Home Tour information.

reported that GODAT sent the first official security update to 576 email addresses. Some email addresses bounced or were caught in Spam filters. We will work on a way to make the communication more real-time. Membership and Constable updates are current through February. Treasurer's Update: Phil Ramirez reported that we have been operating with a surplus for the last two months. It is typical cash flow for this time of year.

Tina now is a monthly contributor herself to several of the gatherings in which she and her mom participated.



RAISING A RESILIENT CHILD

Resilience. This characteristic is one that many experts point to as a key to success. How do we develop resilience in children? As I ponder this question, I am surrounded by examples of this trait. At the moment, I am attending the American Montessori Society Conference in San Francisco with a group of teachers and realize how different our world is due to resilience.

Muir Woods National Monument. John Muir along with a group of dedicated naturalists never gave up on the dream of saving the beloved forest near San Francisco. The groves of trees thousands of years old, were scheduled to be cut and milled into lumber yet Muir and his friends persevered without regard to their personal comfort or financial obligations. They were determined to make a difference in the world for generations to come in spite of overwhelming odds. As the battle continued to through the courts, they maintained their commitment and

remained undeterred. Their resilience ended with President Theodore Roosevelt declaring the forest a national monument and preserving this treasure for us today. How do we encourage children to follow their dreams and to think beyond themselves? How do we ensure that future generations will understand the importance of preserving our earth and the treasures

Redwood trees. The tallest living things on earth. They are perfectly designed for the conditions of the California coastline. Their uniqueness includes the ability to filter the moisture from the foggy air and support the vast forest through a system of interconnecting roots that provides strength and stability to the stands of trees. How do we teach our children the importance of community and caring, of support for one another and the tremendous gifts that each member brings to our world?

Maria Montessori. The first female physician in Italy, she continued to promote non-traditional approaches to education throughout her life. Her contributions to a field dominated by men reverberate in an expanding educational arena around the world. While it would have been comfortable and safe to give up her path, Montessori's resilience kept her going through the challenges she faced. How do we teach children to keep trying when their ideas are unpopular, when their paths are unconventional and their personal comfort is compromised?

Nancy Rambusch... She is credited for sparking the revival in Montessori education in the United States in the early 1960's. In spite of critics and set backs, she persevered and established the American Montessori Society to ensure that educational options to embrace the whole child were made available to educators in the United States. Her commitment to a philosophy centered on fulfilling each child's potential in a peaceful classroom, her one voice has grown to thousands.

Albert Einstein. Many of the adults around him wrote him off as having minimal intellectual capacity. He didn't speak until he was almost 4 years old

and his attempts in traditional school were dismal. He was a dreamer, a theorist, a genius who did not fit the mold. How do we build these capacities in children? Can we measure them on a test?

In education today, the very characteristics that we value and that contribute to the overall well-being and sustainability of a peaceful world are not quantified on a test but are essential to our humanity. As I meet with other Montessori educators from across the country I am reminded of the tremendous gift and responsibility we have to develop the whole child for a world of hope and a promise of peace. Our children will need to be resilient to the pressures of our world to fulfill their potential. This is our charge.

CRITTER CORNER

Critters 101: Herding and Guarding

There are two types of dogs used on livestock farms: herding dogs and guardian dogs. Herding dogs are used to manage the flock (or herd). Guardian dogs are used to protect the flock from predators. Herding dogs need to show dominance, whereas the guardian dog needs to be more submissive in his behavior.

Livestock guardian dog breeds were probably among the first dogs to be domesticated. One of the most common breeds used in the U.S. is the Great Pyrenees of France. This is a very old breed, and has been used for millennia by the shepherds, and are considered an aristocratic relative of the St. Bernard and Newfoundland. Most livestock guardian dogs are large and imposing, weighing 75 to over 100 pounds. They are large enough to startle or intimidate predators.

Not just any breed of dog is used for herding. Common herding breeds include the Border Collie, Australian Shepherd, Australian Kelpie, New Zealand Huntaway, and Australian Cattle Dog. Other breeds with herding instinct include Corgis and Shetland Sheepdogs.

Dogs can work other animals in a variety of ways. Some breeds, such as the Australian Cattle Dog, typically nip at the heels of animals (for this reason they are called heelers) and the Cardigan Welsh Corgi and the Pembroke Welsh Corgi were historically used in a similar fashion. Other breeds, notably the Border Collie, get in front of the animals and use what is called *strong* eye to stare down the animals; they are known as headers. The headers or fetching dogs keep livestock in a group. They consistently go to the front or head of the animals to turn or stop the animal's movement. The heelers or driving dogs keep pushing the animals forward. Typically, they stay behind the herd.

If you live with a livestock guardian dog you have probably noticed it guarding your family and home. Likewise, a herding dog will herd you and the kids if you don't give it a job and enough exercise.






