CIVIC CLUB MEETINGS

Garden Oaks Civic Club Minutes Location: Garden Oaks Elementary

November 6, 2012 Welcome: President Mark Klein called the meeting to order at 7:02 p.m.

Thank you again to Brother's Pizzeria (shopping center at Shepherd and 38th) for providing delicious New York style pizza for everyone attending the meeting!

A motion was made and carried to accept the September minutes as published in the *Gazette*. There were no October minutes due to National Night Out celebrations.

President's Announcements:

Wine Walk: President Klein thanked all the volunteers who supported the Wine Walk. A big thanks to Ed and Brenda de Alba for hosting the successful event.

Section One Proposed Closure:

A request has been made to close the 610/Lawrence cut-through in Section One. If you are interested in supporting this initiative please email president@gardenoaks.org. It will take a unanimous neighbor vote and have significant access and funding requirements. Closures such as this are very difficult to implement.

City Solid Waste Department & Rerouting: President Klein introduced
DeMarcus Glass, Deputy Assistant
Director of the Northeast Service
Center. Glass spoke about the plans
effective November 1st to change the
solid waste disposal routes around
the city. The new large trash removal
policy will eliminate confusion,
increase efficiency, and save dollars.
Citations for large trash will be

waived for the next two months while the new plan is implemented. Specifics can be found at www.houstonsolidwaste.org. All sections of Garden Oaks will now have their heavy trash days the same: the 3rd Thursday of every month.

Deed Restrictions and Section

Four: Garden Oaks continues to have complaints from neighbors about violations in Section Four. It is up to the City to enforce violations, whether they are minor or significant. Donna Edmundson, Chief of Neighborhood Service for the City of Houston, with City Attorneys Heather Cook and Mandy Prichard, spoke about the process of reporting violations and how the City reviews and enforces deed restrictions. They encouraged early reporting of issues via 311, via online form, directly to the City Attorney for District C (Heather Cook), or directly to Donna Edmundson (832-393-6268). There was discussion about when litigation is pursued and the importance of the builder's affidavit that is signed when permitting.

Waltrip High School Band Presidential Inaugural Parade

Fundraiser: Jane Ann Roberts, GO Section One resident and parent of a Waltrip High School band member, spoke about a new fundraising effort for the high school band, the #1 band in Southeast Texas. The band is in the running to march in the Washington D.C. inaugural parade. They are trying to take 150 kids and will need \$140,000 to do so. The district is providing \$50,000. A motion was made and carried to donate \$1,000 of the Civic Club's community budget to support the effort.

Civic Club Nominations: The vote for 2013 officers for the Civic Club will be at the December 4th GOCC

meeting. If you are interested in being an officer or want to nominate someone, please do so prior to the December meeting. The current officers (President Mark Klein, Vice President Vic Seghers, Treasurer Phil Ramirez, and Secretary Heather Leverett) are up for nomination, but welcome newcomers to the board or committees.

GOCC 2013 Annual Budget Review/Treasurer's Update: The proposed 2013 budget is published in the Gazette. It is similar to 2012's. The budget will be voted on at the December meeting.

Standing Committee Reports:

Membership: Dian Austin reported that Wine Walk had 22 sponsors this year and made \$14,000, with minimal expense. In the monthly GOCC attendance drawing, David Garver (Section 5) won a Home Depot gift card.

GO Citizens Patrol: Carl Waters reported 1 crime in September and 5 in October, impacting Sections 1,3, and 4. There have been 68 crimes this year. There were 49 at the same time in 2011. Please pay attention to anyone who might be following you home from the store. There is an increase in the area of people being followed home and burglarized in their driveways.

Constable Program: Terry Jeanes praised the Constables. There have been six arrests by the Constables in Garden Oaks. Three burglaries have been thwarted, two by the deputies and one by large German Shepherds. There have been complaints about rolling through stop signs and the cut-through traffic in Section One due to the 610 construction. There will be no increase in the 2013 GOCC Constable contract.

Beautification: No update.

Gazette: The Constable form will be in the next *Gazette*. Please support the neighborhood Constable program to help keep crime at bay. More financial support could mean more patrols and protection.

Lindsey Pollock reported that the school is waiting for the vote on the HISD bond election (post meeting update: the bond passed). The Constable has been a great help with recent parking challenges, but the school is still struggling with the parking issues in that are impacting the school and neighborhood. Please encourage neighbors to turn in their magnet applications if they are interested in the school. Anyone zoned to the area has priority, but the paperwork must be in place.

Garden Oaks Maintenance Organization (GOMO) Update:

Ed de Alba reported that the annual GOMO meeting was held in October, with board nominations and voting on budget. There is still a three-year position open in Section 3. The vote to provide funds again for the Constable program passed. A vote also passed to pursue electronic speed feedback signs for 43rd. There are requests for other neighborhood locations as well.

President Klein adjourned the meeting at 8:30 pm.

Shout Out For Our Deputies, Become a Supporter, and Cruising for Smiles Toy Drive

Unfortunately unwanted activity has picked up in the area, likely due to the need for cash for the holiday season. Yet the great work of our patrolling deputies, along with HPD, led to arrests of 9 culprits in two weeks.

At 11:45 am the last Monday in October, Deputy Le stopped a suspicious vehicle, detained both individuals, discovered a screwdriver with fresh paint scrapings, and then noticed a rear window where had been an attempted break-in. Both were arrested and had prior burglaries of habitations records. Later in the wee hours of the night near 12:45 a.m, a black male knocked at a homeowner's door on W 38th. The homeowner shouted thru the door and turned to call the constable. Before he could dial the phone, Deputy Sosa along with a back up constable unit pulled up. Within minutes HPD arrived. End of story: arrests of 4 males in the stolen van with floor jacks in the vehicle.

An alert homeowner on W. 30th noted an attempted breakin and immediately called the constable. Although the culprits left, description was out on radio. An HPD unit spotted the vehicle, detained 3 individuals who were positively identified by the neighbor, leading to the arrest of all 3. Good job and work by all.



GENERATOR SELECTION

by Mitch Weigand

Tip No. 30: Choosing a Home Generator: Portable vs. Stand-by Part Three of Three

This is our final column on home generators and which one would be the right choice for you. Let's take a moment to compare them in several crucial areas:

INITIAL PURCHASE

Portable - Definitely the less expensive of the two. For example, you can buy one that generates 4,000 watts of electricity for under \$300. This size will run your refrigerator, some lights and a fan. Stand-by - Get ready to shell out the big bucks. A stand-by generator which can supply 10,000 watts starts around \$3,000. Depending on the size of your home, you may be able to run one of its A/C systems.

FUEL USAGE

Portable - You have a variety of fuels to choose from with propane and gasoline being the most convenient and easiest to obtain. However, you will have to go out and get the fuel from a gas station or hardware store which can be a definite hardship after a major natural disaster such as a hurricane or flood. That is, <u>if</u> the fuel is available which it may or may not be.

Stand-by - Attached to you home's natural gas or liquid propane (LP) gas supply, it's always there and immediately available.

CONVENIENCE

Portable - This kind of generator requires constant monitoring and refilling of fuel. Are you willing to do that at 4:00 in the morning?

Stand-by - Within seconds of an electrical outage, stand-by generators automatically supply power to your home and then shut off by themselves when no longer

needed.

NOISE AND AIR POLLUTION LEVELS

Portable - Think of a lawn mower running non-stop outside your window with the noise and fumes it creates. Not an attractive thought. **Stand-by** - They do make noise which similar to your central A/C system's outside condenser but if properly maintained, there are very little - if any - fumes.

ECONOMY

Portable - What you save in the initial purchase is quickly consumed in fuel costs.

Stand-by - Very economical since it runs on natural or LP gas.

AIR CONDITIONING

Portable - This is asking a lot of a portable generator. You'll need one that can provide at least 8,000 watts to keep you cool plus run your refrigerator and a couple of lights.

Stand-by - Definitely the better choice because of their superior capacity to produce the necessary wattage.

Finally, what is my opinion and which one would I choose? Hands down, if you can afford it, get yourself a stand-by generator. I have one that generates 30,000 watts of electricity which will fulfill all of my needs including three A/C systems plus have enough power left over to help my neighbors. But realistically, be ready to spend \$12,000 for 20,000 watts of power. You'll never regret it. For further information, do some research on "home generators" online or go to a home generator store.
