A motion was made and seconded to approve the September 2014 minutes and the minutes of the special meeting on October 14 as published in the Gazette. The motion passed.

Announcements: In the absence of Nominations Committee chair Victor Seghers, President Briones presented the Committee's slate of candidates for the 2015 Garden Oaks Civic Club Board of Directors:

Treasurer's Report: Treasurer Jerry Butler reported on the Civic Club's current finances and had copies of the Profit and Loss statement and the Balance Sheet available at the meeting. Mr. Butler announced an approximate net of \$22,000 from the Wine Walk for the constable program. A copy of the 2015 proposed budget will be posted on the Garden Oaks website. Adam passed a box for donations to cover expenses and a motion was made and seconded for the Garden Oaks Civic Club to donate \$100 towards Adam's project. Motion passed.

Joe Muscara introduced Mickey Morales of the Farm Stand at Petrol Station. Following an informative talk on the business and pleasure of small agriculture, Mr. Morales demonstrated how to brine a turkey.

The holidays are here once again. I hope yours are safe and bountiful. Here are some important holiday shopping safety reminders:

- Stay alert to your surroundings.
- Avoid trips by yourself after dark when possible. Go with friends or family members; there is safety in numbers.
- Park in well-lit areas as close to the entrance as possible.
- Use checks, debit cards, or credit cards to avoid carrying large amounts of cash. Keep your purse close to your body and or your wallet in your front pocket to make them harder to steal.
- Keep an eye on your purchases when you stop to eat.

- Avoid carrying large numbers of packages; use a package pickup service when you can.
- Have your keys out before you leave the store. Place packages in the trunk of the car or in other hidden areas.
- Fold or cut up large boxes and place them in your recycling bin to keep curious eyes from curbside "shopping" for items they may want to re-gift to themselves.

WHY MONTESSORI?

Only one week after magnet applications opened online, we have received nearly 300 submissions from parents who are interested in enrolling their children in our Montessori program at Garden Oaks! In speaking to many of the parents who have attended tours of the campus, the comments that have struck a chord with me are from parents who desire a method of education that not only ensures academic success, but that also encompasses the education of the whole child including social skills, emotional and spiritual well-being and the perspective of being a global citizen. Concepts that Dr. Montessori included in her cultural studies and "cosmic" education. While Montessori education has been characterized as "free-for-all" by some, this is a far cry from the organized, systematic and structured flow of learning developed by Dr. Montessori's life-time of work with children in countries around the world!

Dr. Montessori's work was developed based on her meticulous observations of children as they worked in communities (classrooms) of hands-on, constructivist activities with teachers as guides of the learning process. Fundamental to her approach was the development of thoughtful children who internalized peaceful interactions with one another and who valued the perspectives of others. Further, she believed that the adults who surround children must safeguard the environment for children to work and develop an awareness of their place in the world to ensure that children build connections to each other and to the global community of humankind. Much of the work Montessori conducted was groundbreaking and viewed as unconventional. Current researchers are rediscovering the work of Montessori and connecting her findings to current brain research and demands of our global society.

Judy Harris Helm recently wrote an article, "Best Brains in Science: Helping Children Develop Intentionally" that

suggested that adults are "to engage children in the intellectual life by supporting the development of traits such as curiosity and the disposition to be thoughtful." Some of the strategies she recommended are profoundly similar to Montessori's work and are useful to parents and teachers working to develop a thoughtful, insightful child:

Listen carefully to children's conversations and identify topics of interest. Follow the child.

Choose topics for work that have potential for hands-on learning. Constructivist learning.

Write down children's responses to show your interest and value in their ideas. Be pecially supportive and ask questions that indicate deep thought.

Encourage children to seek answers and develop their personal perspective of the world. Don't jump in and tell children

the answer. Today information an be found in seconds, but this creates child dependence on adults who have mastered the skills of reading and writing instead of supporting the way young children learn. Encourage children to construct knowledge, to ask questions and explore!

Provoke children's thinking. Challenge them to find answers, to create models and drawings. Encourage children to dream and to work with others! Children are like flowers unfolding. They possess tremendous potential and the hope for our future. As you interact with the developing minds around you, consider the words of G. K. Chesterton, English writer and contemporary of Dr. Montessori "To every man alive, one must hope it has in some way happened that he has talked with his more fascinating friends around a table on some night when all the numerous personalities unfolded themselves like great tropical flowers."

Civic Club Membership has several levels, starting at \$25 (or \$5 for seniors). All residents are welcomed to join, whether you own or rent your home. The Civic Club in Garden Oaks is very active, meeting at 7:00 p.m. on the first Tuesday of every

month at Garden Oaks Montessori. Babysitting is provided by the YMCA for only \$1.00 per child, and meetings generally last no more than an hour. Only paid members are allowed to vote on any issues that require a vote.

residents to come together to seek solutions for neighborhood issues and to share ideas and concerns. Most recently, the Civic Club has actively worked with the City of Houston and Council Member Ellen Cohen to voice the neighborhood's concerns and preferences regarding the Rebuild Houston Storm Water Project, involving streetscape design for Alba and Golf streets.

The Civic Club sponsors the Wine Walk each year, and the Home and Garden Tour every other year. The standing committees include Beautification, Constable Program, Citizens' Patrol, Government Affairs, and Membership. The Civic Club also

actively supports special projects in area HISD feeder schools and Eagle Scout projects for nearby Boy Scout troops. If you have any interest in volunteering in any of these areas or have topics you would like to see at monthly meetings, please email president@gardenoaks.org.

The Constable Program currently involves three different contracts with the county, and provides almost 24/7 coverage. Having an accessible and visible constable patrol at all times in our neighborhood is an effective crime deterrent. Currently, GOMO pays for two of the three contracts, but the third contract is funded by Garden Oaks residents. Each contract costs in excess of \$75,000 per year. Sadly, only about 300 households in Garden Oaks pay their share of the Constable Program, leaving us underfunded each year. The Wine Walk is held annually to raise more funds for the constable


