"There is something new about the way that Americans are killing, robbing, raping and assaulting one another. The curse of violent crime is rampant not just in the ghettos of depressed cities, but everywhere. More significantly, crimes are becoming more brutal, more irrational, more random, and therefore all the more frightening."

Dear Neighbors:

This letter is not meant to be a doom and gloom letter, but I'm mad, and so should you be. Because crime is on the increase, we are losing one of our original residents, and maybe we've already lost others. Just because we put up signs which say 'This Neighborhood Protected by Houstonians On Watch" sponsored by the Houston Police Department doesn't mean that crime and those who are responsible for them are going to stop. Those signs are simply meant to be an indication of your assertiveness and your strong, responsible, responsive attitude anything unusual going on in your neighborhood, more explicitly on your street. How many times have you noted strange cars going slowly down your street, or simply watched strangers meandering down our streets with no apparent aim or purpose? Well, let me assure you that in a good number of those instances, there was an aim and a purpose, one of your neighbors may have paid the price for our desire "NOT TO GET INVOLVED".

Mr. Eddie Childs, President of the Western Companies, based a very effective ad and consequently involvement campaign on the phrase, "I'm Mad". Well, maybe that's going to have to be our slogan, too, to constantly remind ourselves that we are our neighbors' keeper, and he ours, until we all know one another — not to invade each others privacy, but to protect our families, homes, possessions, and self respect.

Our Houstonians On Watch program must do more than teach people people about rudimentary burglary stopping methods such as one-inch dead bolt locks, solid core doors and crime watch stickers on front windows or doors.

We must learn to overcome attitudes born distrust of police, and an attitude of "they can't do anything anyway"; fear retribution from criminals released on bond once we seek to prosecute them, and a sense that crime is a constant, inevitable part of life in the big city now. Baloney to all of those attitudes - the police are capable of assisting; however, we must all face and accept the reality of the problems facing the understaffed Houston Police Department. Instead of allowing burglary victims to hope that they will get their stolen property back - and they probably won't - we must concentrate on cutting the chances of it happening again.

Moreso than ever, there is a growing attitude both locally and federally that you've got to have citizen participation to combat crime.

Crime does not have to be a part of our lives, and it is possible that we and the police can get a grip on crime in Garden Oaks, but you are the key, and unless we can succeed in making people mad because we want to survive as a viable Community (Communication + Unity - see Gazette May, 1981), we have got to fight back in an organized manner.

We want very much to establish a permanent anti-crime task force, but we need your help and input, so be at your next civic club meeting September 1, to hear Mr. Frank Oidtman, a top security consultant with 16 years in security enforcement both domestically and internationally for a major city and who, for the past 8 years has acted as a consultant to major industry on security problems, speak about crime prevention and home security. There will also be a question and answer session at the end of his talk.


