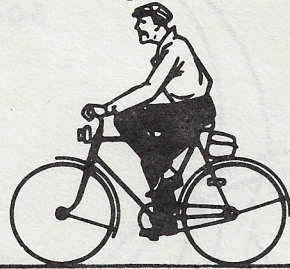

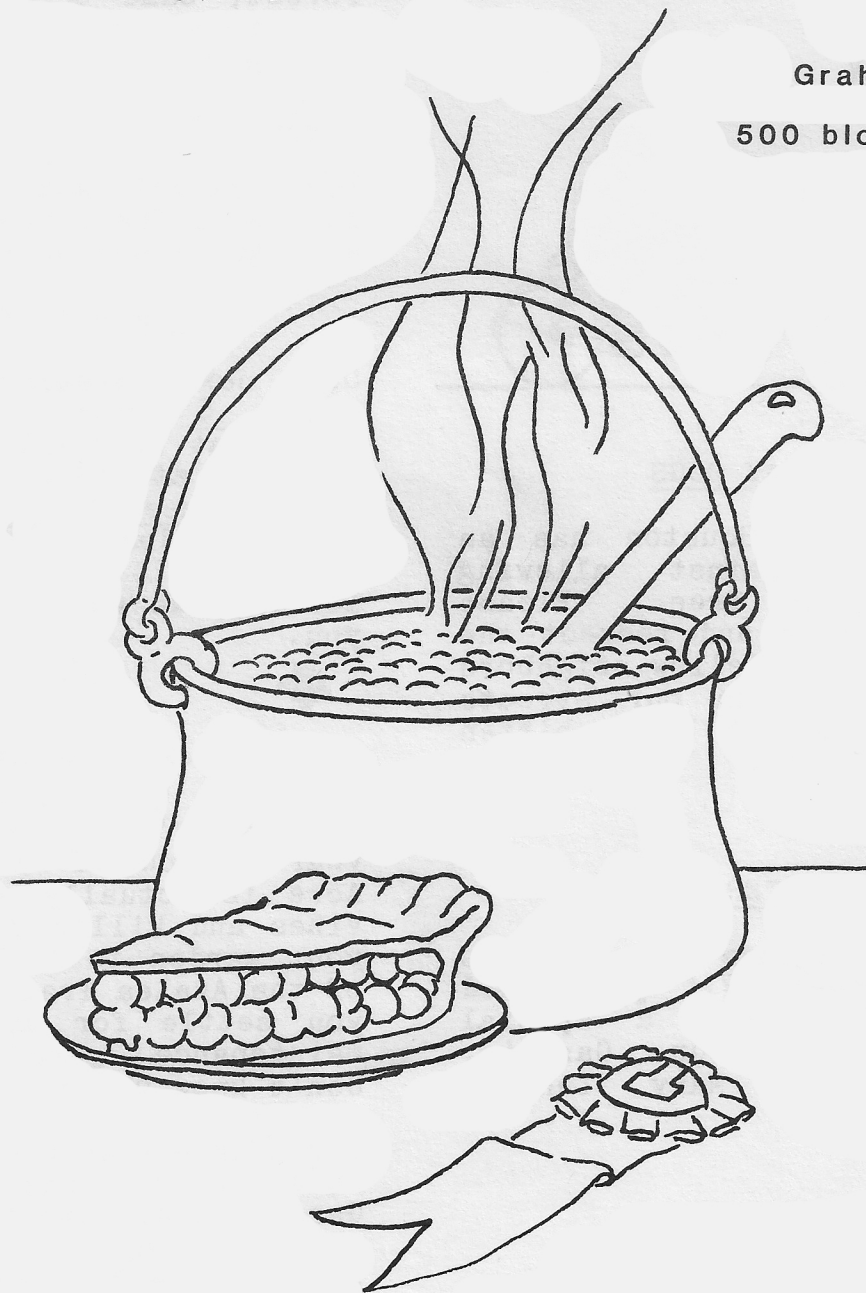
JUNK NEEDED
