

worth buying raffle tickets for.



They are imported from milder and dryer climates. If your nurseyman cannot knowingly discuss the temperature demands of a plant, it is not wise to spend your hard-earned money on that plant. Until I learned that many nurseries only care about making money (rather than caring about plants) I lost hundreds of dollars on plants which died after their beautiful spring blooms had gone.
