SECURITY

SECTION I

If you missed the April meeting, it was reported that only one burglary took place in Section I during March, the first month for the security patrol. Most comments are very favorable and generally everyone seems pleased with the service. Remember you can still sign up. Call Kay Paul 861 0328.

SECTION II

Several citizens met recently to begin surveying Section II residents for interest in the security service. You should be receiving letters soon to explain the program and give you a chance to express your desires. 50% of the residents must sign up for the service to begin .

SECTION III, IV, AND V

In March one burglary took place in Section III, one in Section IV, and three in Section V. These are all daytime burglaries and entry was usually made through a window or back door.

We will continue to give reports on crime in our area, but remember there are many things you can do. Proper locks, a house that looks like some one is home, and neighbors paying attention to what is happening around them are all necessary. Also, please keep garages closed and locked. Lawnmowers and bicycles have trouble getting through locked doors.

Section 20 / 18 Preparation of Tree Trimmings and Hedge Cuttings for Removal
The city collectors will pick up tree trimmings and cuttings if prepared in the following manner: Tie in secure bundles not more than 5 ft. in length nor 18 in. in diameter. Bundles should not weigh in excess of 75 lbs. There is a limit of 4 bundles per pick up day,

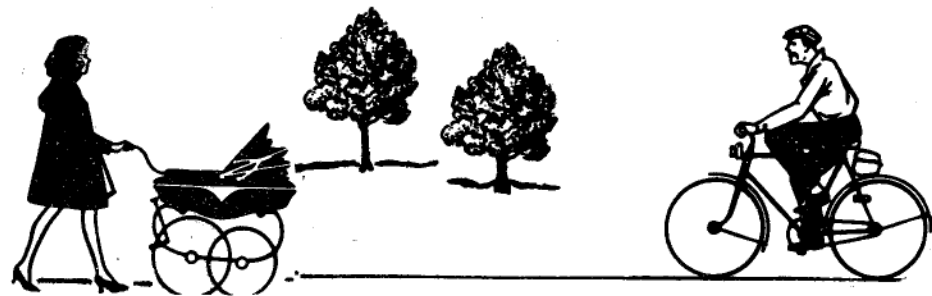
