PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

I have been receiving alot of calls lately and they seem to be about three main issues. First, loose dogs. Last year we published in the Gazette the city ordinance that states a dog must be fenced in your yard or on a leash at all times. Loose dogs cause all kinds of problems from overturned garbage cans to biting people. I fyou own a dog please take the responsibility for conining it. If you are having trouble with loose dogs call the city pound and the dog catcher will try to pick them up. (222-3501)

The second biggest problem is cars parked on the street for long periods. Again a city ordinance forbids parking on public easements for over 24 hours. The police are the ones to call for assistance in getting cars or trucks moved.

The third problem is trashy yards. We can appeal to people's sense of cleanliness and ask them to clean their yards, but that doesn't always work. Y6u can call the health department, mosquito control, and rat control if the situation is bad enough. (222-3011)

All these problems - dogs, cars, and trashy yards, detract from our neighborhood's appearance. I want people to drive through Garden Oaks and see that we are proud of our community and we keep it clean. Won't you do your part toward this goal ?

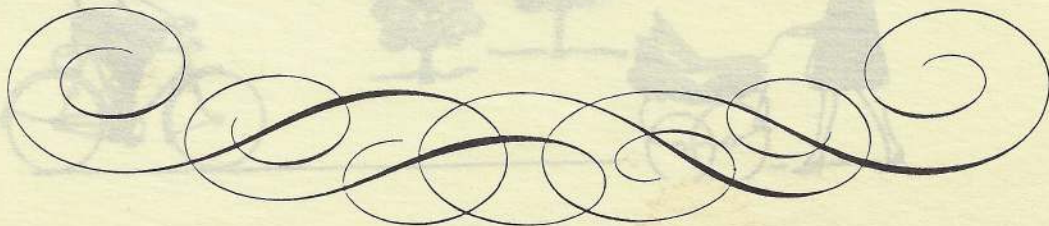
SECURITY

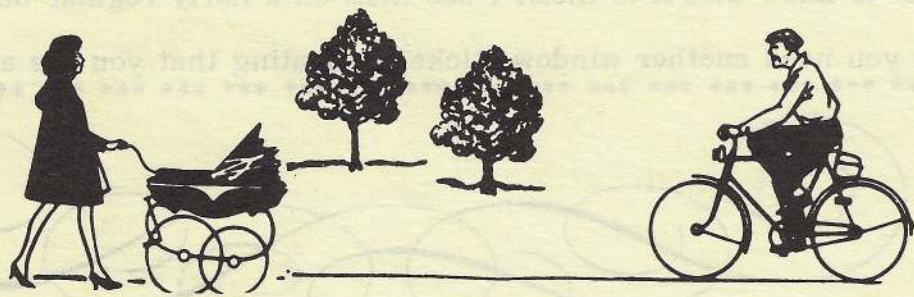
