SECTION I TRAFFIC PROBLEMS

With many residents of Section I complaining of traffic problems on their streets, several residents have formed a committee to pursue a solution to these problems, with particular emphasis on the problem of cut-through traffic. It appears that a large amount of the speeding we are seeing in Section I is from traffic cutting through our neighborhood to avoid the traffic lights at the Loop and Yale and the Loop and Shepherd.

The committee is working with the Traffic and Transportation Department to alleviate some of these problems. A request will be sent to the Department for a traffic study to be done in Section I (east of Shepherd) to determine what steps can be taken to deter some of this traffic. The committee will need the support of the residents of Section I and will be coming around for signatures to attach to the letter requesting the traffic study which will be sent to the Traffic and Transportation Department. Please think about how the traffic in Section I affects you and cooperate with the committee when they come by your home.
