

They patiently observed the owls for a while until they discovered the owls' favorite tree, then installed their new owl box in that tree. Presto! Instant owls! Cassie reports that the owls "seem very pleased with their new home." With landlords like Don and Cassie, how could an owl go wrong?

Congratulations also are in order to Marian Mabry and who each received an owl box at the April meeting of the Civic Club. Someone asks how in the world a person could see or hear something as secretive and unobtrusive as a screech owl. Granted, these small owls don't exactly advertise their presence. Here is my method: stand up, walk across the living room at about seven in the evening and grab the "off/on" button of your TV. Turn it to the "off" position, put on a jacket and go outside. Walk for 30 minutes in any direction, maybe 45 minutes.
