#### **Garden Oaks Civic Club Minutes**

Craig opened the meeting on January 6th, 1998 at 7:10 p.m. Officers in attendance: Craig Lee, Shelly Immel, Ann Spiering and Meredith Jenkins. Absent: Tom Stell. Minutes from the December meeting were amended to include the vote taken on the amendment to the By-laws changing the V.P. Membership to V.P. Welcoming and Membership. Amended minutes were approved by acclamation. Approximately 27 residents were in attendance.

President's Report. Craig introduced the new officers for 1998.

#### Committee Reports

**Treasurer.** Shelly Immel received the account books recently and is in the process of reviewing them. We have \$5,100 in the GOCC operating fund and \$8,900 in our money market account. We have approximately \$3,000 in membership dues received over the past few months to be deposited. The Constable Program is paid monthly from the GOCC Constable account; please send in your checks.

Welcoming and Membership. Shelly reported that Tom is working on the Welcoming packet. A list was circulated for volunteers interested in helping with this project. Anyone with ideas on what to include or who wishes to help, please contact Tom Stell.

**Traffic.** Craig reported that Marc Roberts has resigned as Committee Chairman. Susan and James Garman, West 43rd Street residents, have agreed to head this committee. They will be contacting Marc for the transition of documents, etc.

#### Constable Program. No report.

Gazette. Brenda de Alba reported that deliverers are needed for West 31st Street and for Apollo. This requires approximately 20 minutes per month. Gazettes come collated and ready to pass out. Please call her to help out.

Beautification. Bills for work done on the Garden Oaks Boulevard esplanade have been given to us by the City. We should receive the \$5,000 soon. The next meeting of the Beautification Committee is Tuesday, Jan. 20th at 858 Lamonte. Please come! This meeting will be to set goals and a budget for the 1998 year. Bob Gabrysch spoke briefly about the Community Garden on Alba near Shepherd Park Plaza. This garden was begun 10 years ago. It now consists of 13 raised beds of crops which are donated to food pantries at St. Rose of Lima and St. Matthew's. GOCC pays for the water for the garden, but all other costs and work is on a donated or volunteer basis. It is currently cared for by two non-Garden Oaks residents - more help is needed. Call 686-5493 to help out. The Terry Jeanes Challenge was met and Terry delivered a \$500 check to Brenda: thanks, Terry!

#### President's Message

Our first Civic Club meeting for 1998 was well attended and I thank each of you who came. We began the meeting by getting some information about the "Community Garden". Do you know what this is? Well, there is a plot of land near Alba and Sue Barnett that is dedicated to growing vegetables which is then given to food pantries—lately at St. Rose's Catholic Church and St. Matthew's Methodist Church. While the garden has been active in the past, now only one man tends to it. His name is Bob Gabrysch. Bob does all the soil preparation and tilling, planting, watering, harvesting and packaging. And he delivers the food. But I feel sure he wouldn't mind a little help. You can reach him at 686-5493. Give him a call.

After about 30 minutes of regular business, committee reports, etc. we had an opportunity to hear from the Honorable Bruce Tatro, council member for City of Houston District A (Garden Oaks). Bruce, elected in a runoff in December, replaces the very favorable and honorable Helen Huey, who retired from Council because of term limits. We thank Bruce for taking the time to visit our meeting and look forward to having him return.

I am happy to announce that Susan and James Garman have volunteered their time to cochair the Civic Club's Traffic Committee. I asked them also to follow up on the progress of the sidewalks planned for 43rd Street between Shepherd and Sue Barnett. I think I'll rename the Traffic Committee to "Street and Sidewalks Committee"—seriously. I suspect that if you are interested in getting involved on this committee, they would like to hear from you (688-9052). And if you can think of a better name, I would like to hear from you. Finally, thank you Marc Roberts for all the work you did as chair of this committee.

We heard reports by nearly all committees at the meeting. More details of these reports are in the minutes published in the Gazette. Judi Morawski, chair of the Home and Garden Tour Committee, in particular gave us a pretty darn clear picture of how much help she will need from volunteers for the Tour which will begin May 17th. The Home and Garden Tour is a wonderful showcase of Garden Oaks. It is attended by people from all over the city. But, like a large golf tournament, it requires a lot of volunteers to make it work. The good news is that almost all of the volunteers will be needed only on the two days of the tours. Judi's phone number is 956-8911.

Our Constable Patrol committee has, as usual, a cashflow problem. The problem is not a result of bad management. It's a result of lack of support for the program (I'm not addressing those who paid). Of course, if this or any program is not going to be adequately supported, it must be Section 1 residents: Sorry. dropped. constable's patrol is discontinued, crime issues will gradually begin to surface again. If you are not going to support the constable's patrol, what alternatives could you suggest? (Don't suggest Houston Police should fill the gap because that's-by itself-not going to replace the benefits received by having a dedicated officer cruising the streets). Think about it and let us know. committee's chair is Paul Brinley (862-6286).

The Constable Patrol committee will be meeting in January to decide what to do next. For Section 1 and 1A residents, look for more information coming your way soon if not already by the time you receive this Gazette.

Our next Civic Club meeting will be Tuesday February 3rd. We will have a program given by our very own Tom Stell on the new tax laws and how they affect retirement and new IRA's. Again it will be at Garden Oaks Elementary School's "Multi-Purpose" room. For best access, park in or near the circular drive. #### **Constable Corner**

First of all, Happy New Year to all Garden Oaks residents! I hope everyone had a safe and healthy holiday season.

As the new director of the Constable Program in Section 1 and 1A, and as a new resident of Garden Oaks, my family and I would like to thank those families who have generously supported the program, as well as the many individuals who have spent countless hours working to ensure that the program remains afloat financially.

As we enter 1998, it is time once again to reaffirm that commitment. The contract we maintain with Harris County was just renewed and runs on a calendar year. The cost of the program, is as follows:

•\$230 per family, annual dues •\$750 per business, annual dues

The benefits of our contracted security program to the community are enormous, but to name a just a few:

- · Residents have 24-hour security service, 7 days a week
- Our deputy patrols only a marked area exclusively, during their watch, which increases visibility and reduces repsonse time significantly
- · Alarm system response time is greatly increased
- Vacation or special security watches can be arranged for those participating in the program
- · Most importantly, our deputy is empowered to enforce all aspects of the law, from moving violations to criminal

misconduct.

Implementing the program has worked: from its inception, our property values have risen, and our streets, our children, and our homes are safer than they have ever been.

We have all chosen Garden Oaks as a place to live and raise our children, and I (and believe many others) feel that the Constable Program has been a tremendous asset to the community. Yet, because the program is voluntary, we may not be able to continue funding it through 1998.

Currently, the program is in arrears, and we need to meet immediate financial obligations to continue its existence at all. In the coming days and weeks, you will be contaced by me and hopefully other volunteers to answer any questions you may have about the Constable Program. I believe we all share the same goal: to improve our community, and make it safer for everyone. The Constable Program, through your contined support, is a very big part of this goal.

Please help our community, and make your pledges now. Your contributions may be tax deductible, and should be made payable to: Garden Oaks Civic Club, ATTN: Paul Brinley, 234 W. 32nd St. Houston 77018. And remember: Ana, our deputy, is a part of our community, as well. Finally, I would welcome any

Citizens on Patrol. Only 15 patrollers are currently taking care of our neighborhood. More volunteers are needed. Crime is down in the area. A couple has been noted visiting garage sales in the area and passing counterfeit \$50 bills with their purchases - be aware of them.

**Education.** Bob Setterquist announced that Friends of Montessori at Garden Oaks Elementary are selling cookbooks for \$10 with proceeds benefitting the Montessori Program.

GO Caroling. Tina Sabuco thanked everyone who caroled or donated money or goods. The event was a great success, with \$800 and an additional van of goods collected after the evening of caroling.

#### Old Business

Sidewalks on West 43rd. The addition of sidewalks along West 43rd Street was discussed. Sidewalks will be put in on West 43rd from Shepherd to Sue Barnett on both sides of the street. They will be placed approximately 3 feet from the street in the City easement. The addition of sidewalks to the rest of West 43rd is pending interest from any 43rd St. resident followed by approval by the City.

#### New Business

**Budget.** Craig reported that the budget for 1998 will be presented at the Feb GOCC meeting. The Board will meet prior to the Feb. meeting; all committee chairmen should get their budgets together.

Property on West 30th St. SW Bell has approached Craig concerning the property adjacent to Conn's on West 30th St. This property is deeded residential. SW Bell would like to use this property as an area storage building for their service representatives. They were informed of the deed restrictions and told to contact the Board of Trustees. The Board of Trustees representatives present said they had not been contacted.

#### Presentation.

Bruce Tatro, new City Council Representative for District A, was introduced and discussed his transition into City government, his staff and his ideas on helping District A. An open forum followed.

Refreshments were supplied by Terry Jeanes. The meeting was adjourned at 8:30 p.m.


