Constable Patrol Program

Welcome to Garden Oaks new Deputy Nina Munguia. She will be joining Corporal Santos Torres in patrolling Garden Oaks.

Reminder: At the February Civic Club meeting, there will be a drawing for a \$100 gift card to Lorenzo's, Tony Mandolas, or El Tiempo. All Constable Program contributors for 2020 at the \$250 and up level will be eligible.

More Paid Dues Needed: As we go to press, the current contributions of \$55,000 for the 2020 Constable Program (collected since October's mailer) is not enough to pay for 1 deputy for 2020. If you want to keep deputies on our Garden Oaks streets pay your dues now. Your dues pay for the current year. Current 2020 program contributors are listed at gardenoaks.org (under the Security/Constable tab).

A Special Thank you to Dylan Kincaid, for volunteering to repair the thermometer signs. He answered the call for assistance and actually lives in nearby Independence Heights. Watch the thermometer signs start to rise, starting at lower levels as we begin supporter fees collections. Yes, together let's get the red to rise!!! Everyone can make a difference. For the \$250 annual donation you get a nifty "GO CONSTABLE SUPPORTER" sign in your yard showing your support. The program works. In the past six weeks, our deputies found two expensive bikes that were stolen and returned them, and in early January two rockers and a table were returned within 48 hours after being stolen from a Section 1 porch.

2020 stickers for this year's constable supporters can be picked up at monthly GOCC meetings.

Thanks to Patrick Murphy, Section 4 resident, of Murphy & Vickers, PC, who has once again stepped up to underwrite the cost of more GO Constable Supporter signs.

Garden Oaks is still awaiting the Gulf Coast Development Company's promised \$25,000 contribution to the Constable Program. GCDC has started groundbreaking on the parking lot area between Gabby's and Chase Bank on N. Shepherd. We will continue to follow up.

Harris County Deputy Contracts for 2020 start March 1st and have been signed and returned to Commissioners Court for execution. In order to keep the two deputies per our contracts, it is essential that we get more residential support.



Garden Oaks Civic Club Meeting Minutes

January 7, 2020

Location: Garden Oaks Montessori Magnet (GOMM)

Tonya Knauth, GOCC President, called the meeting to order at 7:05 pm. The meeting was streamed via Facebook Live to the Houston_GO Facebook group for those who could not attend in person.

Business Meeting

Guest speaker and neighbor Shana Tatum, RD gave a talk around mindful eating and the nine types of hunger.

A motion to approve December's meeting minutes was made and seconded. The minutes were approved.

President's Announcements

Incoming President Tonya Knauth welcomed all new visitors and members and thanked the outgoing officers for their service and continued engagement.

Treasurer's Report

Teresa Coleman presented the current financials and noted that both the Civic Club and Constable program revenue through the end of 2019 were better than expected. It was noted that the 2020 budget approved in December is still projected as a deficit and she stressed the importance of increasing both membership enrollment and monetary contributions.

Committee Reports

Constable Program: Terry Jeanes reported donations to date of \$48,920, not including Wine Walk funds. The new constable contracts were signed and will be filed with the county. With each deputy contract costing \$83,000, additional funds are still needed so please consider contributing to help get that red to rise! Anyone who has paid their dues by February 1 will be entered into a drawing for a \$100 restaurant gift card.

She highlighted the recent outstanding work performed by the constables, namely two bicycles being recovered

and the apprehension of a flasher in the Heights.

The \$25,000 donation promised by Gulf Coast Commercial Group remains outstanding and Terry will continue to follow up.

2020 Constable Supporter sign stickers are now available for current contributors. If your sign is damaged, email constable@gardenoaks.org to receive a replacement.

She also requested assistance in putting back up the Garden Oaks signs that were knocked down in the storm last year. If you can help, please contact Terry.

Beautification: Joan Harmon reported that swings were installed at both Gazebo and Triangle parks. Discussions around turning the berm on 30th Street into a grassland were mentioned; however it is still in the budgeting phase.

Tonya expressed the desire to return to a Park Captain model where Garden Oaks community green spaces are led by volunteers. If you are interested in championing a park/community space, please contact Joan.

Garden Oaks.org Website: Pam Parks reported that a short survey is currently posted on gardenoaks.org to solicit feedback from neighborhood residents. If you have not yet taken the survey, please do so as this will help the Civic Club better serve the neighborhood. Results will be posted on gardenoaks.org once the survey is closed.

A website redesign is currently under development, including a new webpage highlighting the Garden Oaks green spaces.

Citizen Patrol: No report; however volunteers are still needed.

Membership: Brenda De Alba (standing in for Dian Austin) reported 151 members of the Civic Club and 176 Constable program supporters so far for 2020.

A plan to increase business memberships and a new resident postcard are both currently being developed. This month's gift card was generously donated by Dylan Kincaid with Stone's Throw Realty.

Government Affairs / GO CIP: Tonya Knauth reported that a link will be added to the website for each of our local elected representatives.

Discussions around the drainage project are still ongoing, with no new update. Golf/Garden Oaks West project is slated to begin in Fall 2020 and should last two years.

Garden Oaks Montessori Magnet: Dr. Pollock reported that applications are still open for Phase 2 via the website. If you have applied and would like a tour, the next tour is January 19th at 9 am. An applicant information session will follow that evening at 6 pm. No RSVP needed for either event.



The Spring Check: Spring Cleaning for Your A/C

Pump it up!

During the Spring check, inspecting your system's freon level and adding some as needed is the most important step. Being just one pound low of freon can increase your monthly electrical bill by nearly \$50! While replacing lost freon and repairing the leak that caused it will cost around \$200-\$350, it's sure a lot cheaper than replacing a burned-out compressor at \$3,000 or more.

What else is done during the Spring check?

Outside

- Check start capacitor and potential relay.
- Check compressor contactor.
- · Check all wiring and connections.
- Check condensing coils.

Inside

- Check voltage and amperage to all motors with meters.
- Check air temperature drop across the evaporator coil.
- Check secondary drain pan.
- Lubricate all moving parts.
- · Check and adjust thermostat.
- · Check filters.
