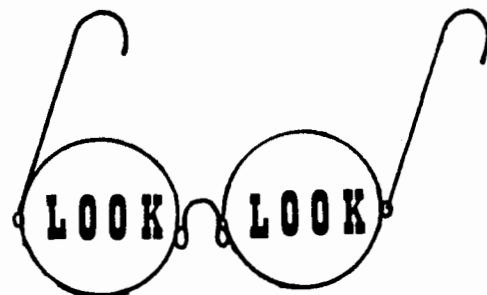
The deadline for boys basketball, ages 7-17 at the Northwest YMCA has been extended - call 869-3378 or go by 1234 W. 34th.

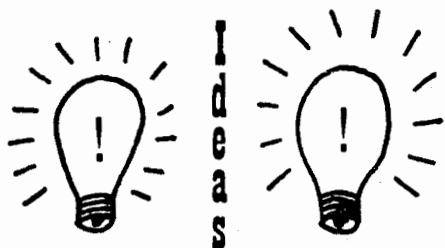
