COUNCILMAN LARRY MCKASKLE TO ADDRESS TUESDAY CLUB MEETING

Councilman Larry McKaskle will address the next Garden Oaks Civic Club meeting, Tuesday night, April 4, 7:30 pm.

McKaskle has been appointed to a committee created to suggest changes to Houston's tax method. The changes could annually adjust revaluations and the tax rate to ease the burden of home owners in reassessed neighborhoods.

The motion to form the group stems from the Monday night tax protest meeting of nearly 4,000 persons from the northwest area. Residents complained of soaring revaluations while other areas are still being taxed on assessments made more than 10 years ago. Councilmen Homer Ford and Louis Macey have also been named to the committee.


