### PRECINCT CHANGES

SECTION ONE voters should have recently received a new white voter registration card with a new precinct number. The new number is 663, changed from 447.

The new precinct boundaries will be the H. B. & T. Railroad tracks north of 34th on the north, Yale on the east, Loop 610 on the south, and White Oak Bayou west of East T.C. Jester on the west. The old 447 included Garden Oaks Section One and dipped south of Loop 610 down to 20th.

Although polling places are not announced until several days before the polls, it is likely that the polling place will move because Holden Elementary is no longer in the same precinct as Section One. The most probable new polling place for 663 is Waltrip High School. Watch your newspaper the day before the election for the official polling place.
