



This information will be entered in a hot line for our patrollers so your home will be watched a little closer during your absence. This hot line is also available for that incident you saw and want to notify/alert G.O. C.O.P. patrollers, or missing dogs, stolen dogs, etc., what ever you think needs to be watched, heard, and spread! If it is something dangerous or a situation for HPD, we will forward the information, if you have not done so yourself. This service is available for Garden Oaks residents throughout the year and we hope it will help make Garden Oaks a safer place for all.

Murphy Wins Super C.O.P. Award

The Super C.O.P. Award is a special thanks and recognition extended to one who has gone beyond the realm of just patrolling our neighborhood. There are so many special helpers who have held the program together and all your efforts are appreciated and Garden Oaks sincerely thanks you for your participation.

Johnny Murphy is our first recipient of the Super C.O.P. Award. Johnny joined in July, 1991, and has been a very active "trucker" averaging 25 hours a month! He has CB equipment and a scanner in his truck and his own base station equipment at home. Johnny's wife, Cindy, backs him as a base station when he is out patrolling the streets of Garden Oaks. They also came as a team to help with the G.O. C.O.P. booth at the Heights Festival this past Fall.

Johnny literally extends the invitation to his neighbors to join G.O. C.O.P. He has recruited a base station and 3 patrollers so far. He carries applications and rule books with him to distribute to interested neighbors. He is also available as a base station from 5PM - 10PM every day. In addition to all this, (as if he hasn't done enough) Johnny has accepted the additional responsibility to compile the monthly figures from HPD for the Gazette and the Civic Club meetings.

Johnny is very interested and a knowledgeable Super C.O.P. patroller dedicated to his volunteer work for our neighborhood. The SUPER C.O.P. Award is pinned on Johnny Murphy and we say THANK YOU, JOHNNY, for all you've done. Keep your nose to the ground (ouch) and your eyes peeled (double ouch).

Clip and Save Recycling Reminders:

WHEN: Second Saturday of the month at 8 a.m.

WHERE: Drop-off at old Civic Club building site on W. 34th Street between N. Shepherd and Brinkman (8 a.m. - 10:30 a.m.) or Curbside (by 8 a.m.)

WHAT AND HOW: NO DUMPING at drop-off site on off days.

ALUMINUM CANS: Non-magnetic, RINSED. NO TIN.

NON-FERROUS (Not Steel) METALS: Items such as copper, brass, and

aluminum. No refrigerators, dishwashers or other appliances.

GLASS: Separated into clear and colored glass; RINSED and CLEANED; NO LIDS; Labels can be left on; NO PLATE GLASS!; No plastic bags, please.

NEWSPAPERS: Bundled or placed in paper grocery bags; No plastic bags please.

COMPUTER PAPER: Bundled, boxed or placed in paper bags; No carbon inserts, no binding, no staples.

WHITE LEDGER: Bond paper bundled, boxed or placed in paper bags; NO glossy junk mail, NCR (No Carbon Required) paper, or telephone books, no binding.

■ BROWN PAPER GROCERY BAGS are also recyclable so use them whenever you can.

PLASTICS: Milk and water jugs, flattened and/or tied together and soda bottles without the black bottoms. RINSED and CLEANED; NO LIDS; #1 and #2 plastics only.

PLEASE FOLLOW THESE GUIDELINES to make the recycling pick-up more efficient and pleasant. Cleaning glass containers and milk jugs and rinsing empty aluminum cans cut down on the odor and mess. If you don't remove the lids or separate the glass, we have to and it slows the process down.

Wet papers and dirty glass or plastic will not be picked-up.


