

#### G.O. C.O.P. Needs YOU

On Saturday morning, Nov. 21, I went downtown to the COP coordinator's workshop. This was a meeting with various other COP groups around the city. I found to my embarrassment that although we are one of the larger areas, we have the lowest participation. One small subdivision, for instance, has only 500 homes but they have 14 base stations (we have 5) and 60 patrollers (we have 10). Does Garden Oaks have egg on its face! We should have 42 base stations and 180 patrollers to equal their proportion.

So, we really need YOUR help. We need your time, your money, or your equipment. It's a known fact that the COP movement has decreased the criminal activity in neighborhoods where the citizens of that community support it and participate. We have the support ... we just don't have much participation. There are some interesting activities that we can get involved in.

First of all, be aware that this COP program is not only sponsored by the Houston Police Department, but they are behind it. Our city council representative, Helen Huey, is very, very aware of the program and she supports it one hundred percent. It's very possible that the city will authorize a new COP sign that can be installed in our neighborhood along where the "HOW" signs are displayed. This is an area where we could use your money (if you can't donate your time) because we will have to buy the signs. We believe that these signs will be a highly visible and positive indication that our community is a single unit working together to keep the criminal element

I hope that this message will be picked up by those of you who can donate some time to our program. WE NEED YOUR HELP! We are looking for those of you who are not already involved with other civic activities because we realize that none of us can do everything. You do not have to belong to the Civic Club, to be a base or patroller. (But more than likely, you would want to.) So, c'mon folks, we cannot continue to keep our heads buried in the sand thinking

that no harm can come to us. Just a few weeks ago, one of our neighbors was followed home and assaulted. Fortunately, the intruder was frightened off and an even more traumatic experience was averted. But, it doesn't always happen to the other guy. We ARE vulnerable. (Incidentally, the house number on the victim's residence was so invisible that the ambulance couldn't find the house on the first try and had to make another pass. PLEASE TAKE ANOTHER LOOK AT YOUR PROPERTY TO MAKE CERTAIN YOUR BOUNDARIES ARE LIGHTED AND YOUR HOUSE **NUMBER IS VISIBLE AND** LEGIBLE.)

There definitely is a high degree of crime in our surrounding area. The police want us to help because they can't be everywhere and they realize that an active, watchful COP is the best deterrent. Right now, we have quality, but not much quantity. When the program first began, 95 signed up. That number quickly diminished to 20 or so. These few have carried the load for two years ... trying to keep YOU and YOUR PROPERTY safe. Unfortunately, these few could burn out. We don't mind the low pay. #### G.O. C.O.P. Needs YOU

On Saturday morning, Nov. 21, I went downtown to the COP coordinator's workshop. This was a meeting with various other COP groups around the city. I found to my embarrassment that although we are one of the larger areas, we have the lowest participation. One small subdivision, for instance, has only 500 homes but they have 14 base stations (we have 5) and 60 patrollers (we have 10). Does Garden Oaks have egg on its face! We should have 42 base stations and 180 patrollers to equal their proportion.

So, we really need YOUR help. We need your time, your money, or your equipment. It's a known fact that the COP movement has decreased the criminal activity in neighborhoods where the citizens of that community support it and participate. We have the support ... we just don't have much participation. There are some interesting activities that we can get involved in.

First of all, be aware that this COP program is not only sponsored by the Houston Police Department, but they are behind it. Our city council representative, Helen Huey, is very, very aware of the program and she supports it one hundred percent. It's very possible that the city will authorize a new COP sign that can be installed in our neighborhood along where the "HOW" signs are displayed. This is an area where we could use your money (if you can't donate your time) because we will have to buy the signs. We believe that these signs will be a highly visible and positive indication that our community is a single unit working together to keep the criminal element

I hope that this message will be picked up by those of you who can donate some time to our program. WE NEED YOUR HELP! We are looking for those of you who are not already involved with other civic activities because we realize that none of us can do everything. You do not have to belong to the Civic Club, to be a base or patroller. (But more than likely, you would want to.) So, c'mon folks, we cannot continue to keep our heads buried in the sand thinking

that no harm can come to us. Just a few weeks ago, one of our neighbors was followed home and assaulted. Fortunately, the intruder was frightened off and an even more traumatic experience was averted. But, it doesn't always happen to the other guy. We ARE vulnerable. (Incidentally, the house number on the victim's residence was so invisible that the ambulance couldn't find the house on the first try and had to make another pass. PLEASE TAKE ANOTHER LOOK AT YOUR PROPERTY TO MAKE CERTAIN YOUR BOUNDARIES ARE LIGHTED AND YOUR HOUSE **NUMBER IS VISIBLE AND** LEGIBLE.)

There definitely is a high degree of crime in our surrounding area. The police want us to help because they can't be everywhere and they realize that an active, watchful COP is the best deterrent. Right now, we have quality, but not much quantity. When the program first began, 95 signed up. That number quickly diminished to 20 or so. These few have carried the load for two years ... trying to keep YOU and YOUR PROPERTY safe. Unfortunately, these few could burn out. We don't mind the low pay.
