The Petition for the proposed traf-fic management plan for Garden Oaks Section One west of Shepherd began circulating among residents of that area in May. The petition for the sections bounded by 43rd, Ella, 34th, and Shepherd began circulating among residents of that area during Revisions resulting from input received from the last public meeting are being applied to the proposed traffic management plan for Garden Oaks Section One between Shepherd and Yale and the petition circulation process in that area section north of 43rd is still under study. The goal of the proposed plans is to effectively manage through-traf-fic in Garden Oaks by making physi-cal changes on Garden Oaks neighborhood streets which alter traffic circulation routes and/or reduce speeding without preventing public and emergency vehicle access to Garden Oaks or diverting traffic through another neighborhood. -continued on page 2-
