Registration will begin March 1st for the Garden Oaks Elementary School Montessori Program. To be eligible for the program the students must be zoned to Garden Oaks. Acceptance is on a first come, first served basis within ethnic age- groupings as defined by the school's demographics. In the past parents have camped out to assure their child a slot in the program.

This year, the program will expand to include an upper elementary class serving third, fourth and fifth graders. Currently there are two 3-6 year old classes (pre-K thru kindergarten) and two 6-9 year old classes (1st thru 3rd grade). These classes are open for observation.
