Dear Editor & Neighbors:

Congratulations!, to Kermit Foster's comments in the June issue Sound-Off in response to Janice Walden's statements in the May issue Sound-Off. Shame on you, Ms. Walden, for encouraging children to play in the streets. But since it may not be entirely safe, let's reroute the cars. Heaven forbid!!

I grew up in Garden Oaks and attended Garden Oaks Elementary, Black and Waltrip. I know what I'm talking about. We were paddled if caught in the streets playing; our backyards, parks and playgrounds were for that.

It's a fact the times have changed. No longer is there one wage earner in the family (Dad) and one automobile. Mom is busy with errands, kids to school, part-time job, etc. and has to have her own car. As soon as Junior turns 16 years old, he usually gets a car to help relieve the stress on Mom. Welcome relief! Before Junior finishes high school and college and moves away, Sissy is now driving and she gets her own car, too. The single car family of 30 years ago, has now become a 3 car family. Sometimes even more. We don't have cut through traffic. We've home grown our own traffic to some degree, through necessity and indulgence. Yes, most of us have spoiled our kids with cars, etc., but let's not let the spoiling start so young that we do not stress safe play habits and adequate supervision until they are old enough and

wise enough to venture into the streets for recreation. Are adults even safe on Houston streets today?

Cars are meant to travel streets. But on Alba, both North and South of West 43rd, speed humps were recently installed. Did it solve the traffic problem? I guess so - the cars are now off the street and into the homeowners yards. They drive around the humps on the streets!! Mission accomplished!! Streets are clear of traffic, but the yards are being destroyed and environmentalists are crying to save the grass. Homeowners are rightfully upset. Now the city has installed three poles on each side of the street humps in the yards to stop the "cut through traffic". Throwing good money after a bad idea is no solution.

I have many dear friends that live on West 43rd Street. They live there with occasional cars hitting a tree in their front yards, frequent major wrecks in front of their homes, and sometimes a car plows into the front room of the house. Of course they don't like it - who would? But that's life on W. 43rd, and something that was considered when they bought there. But let's not forget, 43rd was a small 2 lane street without curbs when they bought their homes.

It was only a few years ago several Garden Oaks residents were on Access Houston on television touting the wonders of this neighborhood - how pleasant it is and country like. Friends, things have not changed in those few short years. It's still a great place!!

We don't need street closures, circles, speed bumps or humps. Be thankful for what you've got. Work together to preserve the integrity of Garden Oaks. Don't try to make it what it's not and what it was never intended to be.

I hope my letter is the last one ever written on this subject. Let it go - enough is enough. Let's all enjoy where we are and work on common goals of the whole community.

HPD crime statistics indicated that there were 3 reported crimes in Garden Oaks in April. They were 2 Burglaries and a Burglary of a Motor Vehicle.

The Burglaries occurred:

Wednesday April 10 at 11:30 a.m. in the 500 Block of W. 32nd and on Friday April 26 at 9:45 a.m. in the 400 block of W. 34th. The Burglary of a Motor Vehicle occurred: Saturday April 13 @ 12:30 a.m. in the 700 block of W. 41st.

For the month of May, Garden Oaks patrollers logged a total of 83 hours which also means the Base Stations Operators were on the air 83 hours to monitor them. At this time I would like to thank the base station operators who remain at home week after week to maintain the safety of the patrollers. They are a vital link in the Citizens Patrol organization and we could not function without them.

The Citizens Patrol would like to welcome its two newest members. Ken and Colleen Blakely who live in 300 block of W. 34th. Ken and Colleen began patrolling at the end of May.

I would also like to acknowledge the efforts of two of our veteran patrollers. Edith Rider and Mildred Warhol who have been patrolling since the start of the program. As of March, they had accumulated 400 hours of patrolling which qualifies them for a 2 hour ride with the HPD helicopter. We will keep you posted on their airborne adventures.

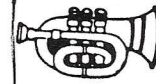
PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

We took advantage of not having a speaker at our last civic club meeting and devoted it to issues confronting the neighborhood. It was a lengthy but good discussion. And I'm happy to say there were no surprises and that we have committees working on all of the issues brought up in the meeting.

The most pleasant topic by far was an award presented to the community by Educational Liaison Jane Ann Roberts on the behalf of Garden Oaks Elementary. The students, their teachers, Principal Eugenia Daniels and the Friends of Montessori can be rightfully proud of the significant improvements in the students' TAAS scores. A job well done and congratulations to all involved! I am so proud of and impressed by our involvement not only because of the excellent results, but also because this is a model of how all our schools should be and I hope in time will be. Well Done!

Less pleasant but no less important was a request by HPD to get neighborhood approval to close the North Shepherd Substation and open a Store Front Facility in the shopping center west of Ella. There are several benefits to this plan in the form of a larger police presence, better proximity to the community, and lower expenses for HPD. The plan has one negative in that the store front will have no provision for walk-in traffic. Some concerns were raised about the longevity of the police presence, how many officers, hours of operation, etc. and the community members present voted to give Carl Waters and I the authority to vote in favor of the store front if we felt the neighborhood concerns were addressed adequately.

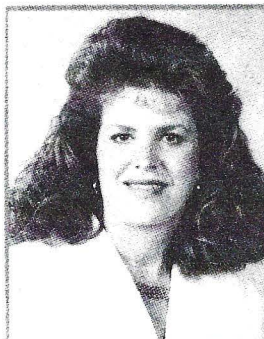

NOTICE TO CITY OF HOUSTON WATER CUSTOMERS IN THE ACRES HOME AREA

As part of the City of Houston's effort to reduce land sinking, the City is changing from underground well water to surface or lake water. Using underground well water is the major reason Houston's land is sinking. In a few weeks the water supply for the Acres Homes Area will shift from well water to lake water.

When the change takes place, your drinking water will look the same, but you may notice a slight change in the taste or odor. The change in taste or odor is the difference between well water and lake water and a different treatment process. Even with these differences your drinking water exceeds all state and federal requirements making your water perfectly safe to drink.

To treat well water, we use chlorine as a disinfectant. In treating surface water we use a combination of chlorine and ammonia called chloramines. The use of chloramine is of special interest to RENAL DIALYSIS and AQUARIUM owners. We suggest you contact the equipment manufacturer or qualified representative to help you with any pretreatment changes you may have to make.

The subdivisions in the Acres Homes area affected by the change in water supply are Oaks of Inwood, Antoine East, Oakdale, Inwood Pines, Highland Gardens, Highland Heights, Lincoln City, Melrose Gardens, Yorkdale, Shepherd Park Terrace, Shepherd Park Plaza, Candlelight Estates, Garden Oaks, Pine Forest, Oak Forest.

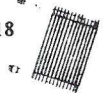

GARDEN OAKS CIVIC CLUB MEETING MINUTES FOR 6/4/96

President Ed de Alba called the meeting to order at 7:10 P.M.

Ed called for a motion and the motion was seconded to adopt the minutes of the May meeting as printed in the June *Gazette*. There was no speaker for tonight's meeting. For the next two months there will be no meetings due to the July 4th Parade and National Night Out. Meetings will resume in September. Ed mentioned the Mark Neff challenge was met and thanked everyone for their contributions.

Committee Reports: Ann Spiering gave an update on the park plans and it looks like the construction is on track for completion for sometime in August.

School Report: Jayne Ann Roberts reported on the excellent results of the Garden Oaks Elementary TAAS scores.

Traffic Report: Mark Roberts reported that requests for speed humps have exceeded funding; there are 8 streets in Garden Oaks requesting speed humps, but only one on 38th Street has been funded. Those that have been approved are qualified for funding for up to two years. Section 1A's Traffic Plan is still in legal review.

GO COP Report: A two hour HPD helicopter ride was awarded to Edith Rider and Mildred Warhol for the accumulation of over 400 hours of patrolling. There are two new members, Ken and Colleen Blakely. Captain DeFoor of the HPD has suggested having a Store Front location instead of the North Shepherd Station. Captain DeFoor feels the money is better spent with the Store Front concept. Ed de Alba made a motion to give tentative approval for a store front. After discussion, the motion was amended to give approval if satisfactory answers to these questions were given: Where would it be located, for how long would the commitment be, and how many officers would be stationed there? The motion passed.

Beautification: Misty Jones put out a call for volunteers and has plans to set up a file for future committee chairs. Also, she has plans to meet with the officers and present what the committee has in mind.

Mark Neff Challenge: Craig Lee reported they were able to raise \$777.00 from 28 people and therefore met the challenge to match \$500.00 by the end of May. All contributors were mentioned by roll call.

Sign Committee: Johnny Murphy was drafted (in his absence) as part of a committee to repair the Garden Oaks signs since he did such a great job repairing one near his home and for a minimal cost.

Sound Wall Project: Larry Davenport volunteered to take the job of bringing a sound wall to the North Loop between Yale St. and Ella Blvd. Alex Martinez reported a sound wall being constructed on the North Loop between Hardy and Fulton Streets, which was approved for funding 5 years ago and that TxDOT will not build one if there is no funding approved. Efforts will continue.

Hospitality: Terry Jeanes provided the refreshments.

Meeting was adjourned.
