CITIZEN'S PATROL

. I hope everyone had a safe and happy 4th of July and now our thoughts turn to the annual National Night Out celebration on 8/6/96. I hope as many of you as possible have a block party and getting to know your new neighbors as well as reacquaint yourselves with the old ones.

Crime stats for the month of May showed no reported crimes in the Garden Oaks Area. Let's keep up the good work one and all. During June the Citizen Patrol group patrolled 83 hours which was matched by an equal number of hours monitoring patrollers by our base station operators. A big tip of the patrol hat goes out to Base operators V.D. and LaVerne Kelly and Woody Mehrkam who monitor the lion's share of the hours each month.

On a sad note, one of our former patrollers, Joyce Skeen, passed away in early July. She and her husband, Walter, were faithful patrollers through late last year. She will be missed and we extend condolences to their family.

At the June Civic Club meeting I introduced a proposal from HPD Captain Defoor, for the development of a Unit known as a Differential Response team, to replace the 2 officers currently staying in the North Shepherd substation. I have had a couple of follow up conversations with the Captain, which provided the following information:

Currently HPD has 2 officers assigned to the North Shepherd Substation 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, for the purpose of taking walk-in reports and complaints from citizens. They will remain there until a decision is made on the status of the substation. As stated at the June meeting, to keep the building open will cost \$35,000 to \$37,000 annually for utilities, maintenance and repairs.

If the Differential Response Team is established, Captain Defoor stated he would commit 10 officers and a Sergeant to the program. The officers would work a 40 hour work week Tuesday through Saturday mid mornings to early evening (approximately 10:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m.).

Their duties would include the following:

- · Patrol their beat and be highly visible.
- · Assist in the investigation of crime in their beat area.
- Volunteer for Priority One calls when in close proximity.
- Work closely with civic groups, businesses and individual citizens to identify problems that affect the quality of life in the area.
- Handle Community problems that are not considered traditional law enforcement functions like RAT ON A RAT AND NUISANCE ABATEMENT PROGRAMS with Neighborhood Protective Services.
- Assist Beat Officers in updating business and citizen group contacts.
- Develop Patrol Management Plans to address crime trends and patterns in the community that require additional resources to manage.
- Work closely with Divisional Gang Units and Storefronts in adjacent beats to address common gang problems and activities.
- · Document and report graffiti in the area to be cleaned up.
- Liaison with area school officials to address problems they might experience during and after school.
- Attend monthly Civic Association meetings and functions related to area businesses.

If the area neighborhoods agree with this proposal an organizing committee would be formed to choose a sight which would have to approved by the City, and then designed and built. Area residents on the committee would have input to the process along the way. One site currently under evaluation is located in the shopping center on the southwest corner of the intersection of 43rd and Ella. Weingarten Reality, which owns the property, has indicated they would be willing to lease space to the City for \$1 a year. No agreement has been reached at this time, but since the City has similar leases with Weingarten, the legalities of a lease could be sped up by using wording similar to other contracts.
