Garden Oaks residents were out in force for this year's National Night Out held Tuesday, August 5. Residents turned on their porch lights and held block parties and cookouts for the sole purpose of meeting their neighbors.

National Night Out gatherings were held at the following locations: 1019 W. 41st, 523 W. 32nd, 701 W. 31st, 859 Azalea, 1519 Sue Barnett, 907 W. 42nd, 963 Althea, and 220 W. 34th.

National Night Out (NNO) was begun in 1983 in the state of Pennsylvania and has grown into a national, yearly event. Estimates are that some 27 million people world-wide participated in this year's event.

The event helped strengthen neighborhood spirit and offered residents the opportunity to meet their area's law enforcement officials and also served as a training ground for everyone to be more civic-minded.

One of the highlights of the

night came to the residents on W. 34th Street. They were treated to a helicopter demonstration by HPD. Herb Parr, an HPD officer who grew up in Garden Oaks, communicated with the helicopter hovering above the crowd doing some "fancy footwork."

Herb, whose grandmother is Katherine Hardin (a Section 1 resident and a founding member of the Garden Club) explained that the helicopter works in conjunction with the HPD ground unit to identify and secure suspects involved in criminal activity.


esplanade, do so. The beautification committee did an exceptional job. Look for work days this fall-and join the fun.





HPD Reports Four Crimes in July

In July, HPD reported four crimes in the neighborhood. They were: 1) An assault in the 400 block of W. 33rd on June 23 at 5:15 p.m. 2) Three burglaries. They occurred in the 1000 block of Gardenia on June 9 at 5 p.m.; 1000 block of Sue Barnett on June 13 at 8 a.m.; and the 800 block of W. 30th on June 14 at 8:18 a.m.

GO-COP patrollers and base stations were active for 70 hours for the month.

Patroller of the month is Woody Mehrkam, a long time member of the patrol unit. Woody was one of the first patrollers to earn a helicopter honor with HPD

as a reward for his extending service with the program. Currently Woody has over 650 hours of patrolling and works as a base station operator three days a week. Thanks Woody for your time and commitment to making Garden Oaks a safer community for all of us!

GO Elementary News

The school year has begun and we're busy at Garden Oaks Elementary. Thanks to all who participated in our "Welcome with a Hug" program. The smiles on the faces of our small children was well worth our combined efforts!

Garden Oaks Elementary recently received a \$5,000 grant from Southwestern Bell Telephone to begin a bilingual Family Reading and Family Math Morning. This program is an extension of the successful Family Reading and Family Math Nights begun last year. We enjoy having the whole family participate in activities and stories surrounding great children's literature. Families also learn fun ways to make mathematics a natural part of family life.

Our school will also continue the Families Count program. This will be the final year of a \$500,000 grant that involves three elementary schools. The program provides family counseling and support programs to help students succeed in school. Through this program, we have additional staff on campus to meet with parents and provide home-based family counseling, classes and workshops for parents. A Garden Oaks networking group of local business and community representatives meets monthly to assist with the school and the program. Anyone interested may call 696-2930 for more information.

We need help with our Adopt-a-Student tutoring program. If you can spare one or two hours per week to assist students in reading, writing or mathematics, your help is needed. Our goal is to double the number of volunteer tutors from last year. This program is instrumental in helping low achievers gain success in learning.

Finally we are proud to again be an HISD Exemplary School! Thanks to the civic club and the GO community in helping make this possible.
