Maybe more than 100, maybe not all oaks, maybe in parks, ROW or your yard?

### Pam Parks, Beautification Chair

**The concept:** Plant 100 oaks (100 oaks is a placeholder for a large number of trees) in Garden Oaks. The plantings would be in CoH parks and ROWs and be done in partnership with Trees for Houston. The proposal will include maps showing proposed planting locations and will specify approved species.

The concept of planting trees in public green spaces is being matched with a Tree Give-Away Event hosted by GOCC and SPPCC for owners wishing to plant trees on their properties. The cumulative planting of free trees by property owners and the planting of larger trees on public greenspaces will very likely far exceed the goal of 100 trees.

#### **Why More Trees?**

- Trees mitigate flooding.
- Trees mitigate air pollution.
- Trees mitigate noise pollution.
- Trees harbor/support wildlife.
- Trees mitigate urban heat island effects.
- Trees and nature support human well-being.

Any wonder that trees improve property value?

#### We Need to Plant Trees to Have Trees

- Mowing and weeding of our landscapes undoes the fine work of squirrels, birds and other natural propagation.
- Use of herbicides harms trees the "root reach" of trees is well beyond the drip-line. There is not guaranteed safe zone for most herbicides in our yards.
  - Construction damages tree roots.
- Excessive or shallow watering interferes with healthy root development.

A typical property with a dozen trees may have no trees after 60 years of conventional maintenance. It makes sense to be "planting ahead" for the inevitable demise of almost all of our tree species.

To get the conversations started I have tossed out some numbers to our Park Captains and anyone who wants to contribute to building the maps.

- 13 trees for GO Blvd -replace two fallen trees and add several more!
- 4 trees at Friendship Garden (Lawrence & W30)replacements for Redbud and add Oak.
- 6 trees at the Rose Garden (Lawrence & W34)- Mexican buckeye for rain garden plus 2 replacement oaks.
- 6 trees for the Randall Berm (Randall & W30)-replace trees lost to traffic accidents.
- 5 trees for Durham Wedge (Randall & W30) -replace sickly crepe myrtles, replace fallen tree and add a few others.
- 5 trees for the Art Park (Sue Barnett & W 43)-replace the half dozen fallen and removed in last few years and add a couple more.
  - 7 trees for the Spark Park and GOMM Campus.
- 12 trees for American Legion Park fill in gaps in the tree line along south side (RR track) of Park for noise mitigation.
- 12 trees for Graham Park fill in 2 rows of trees paralleling RR tracks for noise mitigation. Special need is for wet tolerant species.
- ? for Community Garden fruit/nut trees under consideration would fall outside of Trees for Houston program.

#### Costs

Trees for Houston will provide trees and plant them for the areas I am proposing. Our obligation will be watering them all for two years. The majority of trees listed above are covered by our 6 working irrigation systems. Cost estimates and tree counts are being estimated with a plan to seek GOCC funding and donations from individuals.

Double the Fun - bring an adjoining neighborhood along —To take this to the next level, we are proposing to match our efforts in Garden Oaks with a similar effort in Independence Heights.

## AIA Home Tour Showcases Garden Oaks Home

2-day self-guided tour, October 23-24, 2021

The American Institute of Architects (AIA) Houston will hold its 2021 Annual Home Tour featuring eight area homes selected by a jury of industry experts to represent the finest in new residential architecture. The two-day, self-guided tour is open to the public and offers attendees a rare opportunity to walk through and view an impressive assortment of privately owned residences designed by accomplished Houston architects.

TICKETS (Valid for both days) can be purchased in advance thru 10/19 at aiahoustonhometour.org or on the day of the tour at any of the 8 featured homes. Masks will be required.

## Featured on the Tour is 3007 Lawrence Street, Garden Oaks Section 1. 4300 square feet

This home is situated in Garden Oaks (across from Friendship Garden). The 80' x 240' lot is unusually deep—twice the depth of an average residential lot. The two-story massing is stepped back from the front of the house to align with other two-story homes on the block-face.

Acoustics played a major role in the building's form. The U-shaped plan is designed to block noise within the pool courtyard from the heavily trafficked street one block to the west and the freeway two blocks to the south. The courtyard is on the north side of the house, providing views of the neighbor's stately oak trees, and uses the two-story bedroom wing to shade the infinity-edged pool.

The glass exterior canopy, the large pivot door and expansive view greet visitors upon arrival, all within a defined entry area. The entry trellis, dining room ceiling, interior brick core, and screened porch were developed as "moments of richness," characterizing the way they enhance the home's design within an overall modest construction budget.

Reducing negative environmental impact, the home achieves sustainability by minimizing west fenestration, maximizing north windows, sealed construction, and higherficiency air conditioning equipment.

The home tour is a nonprofit fundraiser and supports various AIA Houston initiatives throughout the year.

#### Details, be large or small, can be important.

Case in point, in early July when we had a lot of rain, the back part of our back yard was holding a lot of water. I had gone out during a pause in the rain to move the recycling and trash bins out for pick up. While negotiating the ponding water I noticed bubbles coming up to the surface. At first, I thought they were just bubbles produced by the water dripping from the tree overhead. I decided to stop for a closer look and saw that bubbles were indeed coming up from the ground in several spots along a straight line. I scooped up some of the water with the bubbles and sure enough, gas! It was fixed that very morning and all is well, except for the mud pit that was left by a small backhoe. Potential huge issue averted!

The point here is that no matter how small a detail may seem, it can be a crucial one. Ever seen something going on at a neighbor's home that did not feel quite right, but shrugged it off? Did it bug you all day? On a few occasions while patrolling, I have called in a few sightings that appeared suspicious. They weren't in the end but they might have been. The constable would reach out with an update after investigating. Better safe than sorry.

We need volunteers. For a limited time and because of budgetary constraints, I am offering a \$25 sign on bonus, payable as a gift card of your choice once you complete certification and take an initial tour with me to learn the ropes. This will be forwarded to the officer who conducts the training. They in turn will reach out to you with forms to fill out and later communicate a certification date. To qualify, you must reside in Garden Oaks, be at least 18 years old, and pass a background check.

## Garden Oaks Civic Club Meeting Minutes

August 3, 2021 via Zoom online application

President Tonya Knauth called the September meeting to order at 7:04 pm and welcomed attendees. There will be no general business meeting in October in lieu of National Night Out. We are hopeful that the November meeting will be held in person.

The August meeting minutes were printed in the Garden Oaks Gazette. Mike Stephens moved to accept the minutes, seconded by Sheila Briones, and the motion passed without opposition.

Heather Houston with Scenic Houston gave a synopsis of the CoH's proposal to install 50 new digital LED billboards on city property around Houston. These new billboards will likely be located in areas seeing growth and investment. The City will require that three static billboards be removed for every new digital billboard erected. However, the new digital billboards will not necessarily be located where the existing ones are removed, but rather in new locations around Houston. Scenic Houston is asking civic clubs and neighborhoods to join them in opposing these new digital billboards by contacting the Mayor and City Council members. 

**Beautification:** Pam Parks noted that the Rose Garden project is almost complete with the purchase of two picnic tables which should be installed by the middle of September. A workday is planned for September 25th.

Gazebo Park also has a workday planned for September 18th.

A Trees for Houston tree-giveaway co-hosted by GOCC and SPP Civic Club is scheduled for Saturday, November 13 at 9:00 am at the Community Garden on Alba. There will be 100 trees to giveaway to neighbors to plant and maintain in their yards.

Pam made a motion that we begin maintaining the METRO bus stop on Durham near the Randall berm and the landscaped island at Apollo and West 43rd at a cost of \$360 for the remainder of the year; this would be added to our existing landscaping budget. Paul Vincent seconded the motion, and it carried via vote of the attendees.

GardenOaks.org: Annual hosting fees are paid, and the website is current and operating well.

**GO Citizens Patrol:** If anyone would like to participate, please contact Mark Saranie.

**Membership:** Tonya gave Dian Austin's report in her absence, stating there are 287 paid members of the GOCC now. Members and business members are posted on the website.

Dian is also working on the Wine Walk, and reported that the Covid landscape has not changed as hoped, and as such, the committee does not have confidence that the situation will be any better in November when the Wine Walk is scheduled, so the event is postponed until Fall 2022.

We've seen an increase of 30% in Instagram followers in the past month. John also created a new Facebook general account for the GO neighborhood which will be easier to monitor and transfer among moderators in the future. Government Affairs/CIP: Tonya shared that construction began on the Phase II Golf drainage project at Wakefield today. Problems related to the construction project should be directed to Tonya Knauth, president@gardenoaks.org and she will contact the city directly. Please use this avenue for concerns, complaints, and compliments versus calling 311. The project is beginning on Golf between Judiway and Wakefield. Each block should take 4-6 weeks to complete. All schematics and public information are online at <a href="https://www.gardenoaks.org">www.gardenoaks.org</a>. The City has been very responsive to questions and concerns, including a request to not preemptively trim or cut trees along the route until they determine when and where to cut.

We still have no response to the GOCC sidewalk variance request for the Phase 3 Sue Barnett drainage project which will not begin for several more years. The City of Houston will hold a Sidewalk Summit which Tonya plans to attend and report back to GOCC. Our general waiver request to exempt all new construction and rehabilitation from the new sidewalk requirements has not been addressed yet either. (continued on page 18)

#### **Kindergarten-12 Grade APPLICATION PHASES:**

Phase 1 (September 17, 2021 – November 11, 2021)

All qualified applications submitted during Phase I will be entered either in a lottery or will be eligible for auditions at secondary fine arts programs. Rankings as well as deleting/ adding schools, can be changed until November 10,

2021. Notification of Lottery Status is January 27, 2022.

Phase 2 (November 12, 2021 – March 10,

All qualified in-district applicants will be considered on a space-available and will be placed on the offered list after Phase II closes. These applications are not considered in the lottery. The applications will be re-ordered by time/date stamp and added to the end of the Phase 1 waitlist if space is available. If you apply in Phase 1, you do not need to reapply for Phase 2.

• Phase 3 (March 11, 2022 - Onward)
All qualified applicants that are currently NOT in HISD or out of district will be considered on a space-available and firstcome-first-served basis. If you apply in Phase 1 or 2, you do not need to reapply for Phase 3.

#### <u>PreKindergarten - all PK seats are by lottery ONLY.</u>

- Applications for PK are open September 17, 2021 – March 10, 2022 - In-district, TEA Eligible applications and tuition-based applications received will be entered into the lottery. Applications received after this date will be offered only by space available and in order of submission
- Rankings can be changed, schools deleted or added, until March 10, 2022
- Notification day for all PK applications is March 31, 2022.
- Tuition-based applications will be considered after April 15, 2022, and after all "eligible" applications have been offered seats, and if space is available.

Zoned families must confirm they are living withing the school zone by providing 3 of the following proofs of address: current utility bill (water, gas or electric), HCAD statement stating "Homestead Exemption" or current lease. Due to limited space, any applications after February 10, 2022, may be put on a grade level waitlist in order of submission.

Students who are 5 years old on or by September 1 are eligible for Kindergarten.

## How To Beat the Final Days of Heat and Humidity – Part One

While dealing now with the highest temperatures and humidity of the year, your A/C system is being put to its most rigorous test right when it's needed the most. This is also when problems can occur which may turn into major expenses next year. Correcting them now can be much more cost-effective. Here's what to look for:

#### Restricted air flow

Free air flow is absolutely essential for your A/C system. In Houston, air conditioners run all summer long and can develop fan motor issues and clogged filters. These inhibit air flow and decrease your system's overall efficiency.

Misaligned fans tend to strike against their casings, causing quite a racket. Whether the result of accumulated debris or improper installation, a misaligned fan will only worsen while the system runs. Be alert to any rattling sounds.

When clogged air filters are the problem, your A/C system works harder to compensate for the blockage, putting

tremendous strain on it during the hottest part of the year. Replace these filters every month. Clogged filters can affect your home's indoor air quality plus shorten the life of your system.

#### Low Freon

Freon leaks increase your energy usage, and also prevent your A/C from doing its job properly. Signs of a freon leak include a much lower cooling output and frost accumulation on the A/C's evaporator coils.

Additionally, when your system is low on freon, it seems to run nonstop and take forever to cool your house down. That's because there isn't enough freon available to absorb the heat effectively, and the air blowing out of your home's vents is warmer than normal. Call your A/C service technician to perform a diagnostic check to locate any leaks and restore the system's freon to its proper level.
