

Troubleshooting Tips for Gas Furnaces

- (1) **Inspect and replace the air filter.** Clogged filters cause problems and money. If your furnace is running inefficiently or shutting down prematurely, remove the filter and inspect it for excess dust and debris. Always, always, always replace filters on a regular basis.
- (2) Check the furnace's circuit breaker. Sometimes when your furnace won't run, it's due to a tripped circuit breaker. If it's tripped, no power can be sent to the furnace. Go to the circuit box, and make sure the furnace's circuit breaker is switched to the "on" position.
- (3) Check the settings on the thermostat. If your furnace doesn't seem to be running, check your thermostat. Make sure it is turned on, set to heat mode and the temperature is higher than the ambient temp in your home.
- (4) Examine all registers and return air vents. Diminished air flow occurring in your ceiling registers and return air vents can also affect your furnace's performance. Make sure they are open and not obstructed by furniture, plants or other objects.

When it's time to call an A/C service technician

- (1) The furnace is short cycling. Short cycling is when your furnace runs for only a short time (typically two to three minutes) and then shuts off. This cycle is repeated over and over again. Usually short cycling is caused when the thermostat is out of adjustment or the heat exchanger overheats, making the burner shut off to prevent damage.
- (2) **The flame is irregular.** Within the furnace, properly functioning burners have fairly even rows of flames. If the flames are uneven, it could be a sign of dirty burners or a cracked heat exchanger.
- (3) You hear odd noises or rumbling. While rumbling and popping aren't cause for concern in a hot water or steam heating system, they shouldn't occur when you have a gas furnace.
