

The meeting was called to order at 7:30 by President Tonya Knauth.

The guest speaker was Alan Krathaus with CORE Design Studio, who is spearheading the Garden Oaks rebranding efforts. Alan presented the finalized logo design including various logo styles and color palettes to be used for collateral and stationery.

Some additional uses shown were new signage for entrances, banners, street signs and dog waste stations. The results shown received very positive feedback. The next step will be receiving the deliverables to support potential applications.

Following the presentation, a motion to accept September meeting minutes was made, seconded and approved.

Paul Vincent presented the November treasurer's report and highlighted the success of the Azalea Street event which


raised \$30,000 for the constable program.

She requested any issues be brought up to the constable dispatch or via Terry Jeanes who is the constable liaison. She also brought gun locks to share with anyone who wanted them.

The huge success of the first Azalea Street Wine & Beer Extravaganza was discussed with thanks to the planning group, volunteers, and all participants. A recap will be done by the committee to capture the positives and areas of opportunity for next year.



They attach a large suction tube to one of the vents and run a fringed tether through the duct. By spinning vigorously, it dislodges the accumulated debris which coats the duct's interior. This debris is then sucked through the tube and into their van outside, never contaminating your home. The technicians proceed to each vent throughout your home until all of the ductwork has been cleaned.

Along with the ductwork, they should also clean the following: Supply and return grilles, plenum, heat exchanger, blower motor, assembly and housing, and the evaporator coil, drain and drain pan. Your entire A/C system will benefit from this cleaning. This leaves your home's air healthy and clean.
