A History of the Caesar Salad and Where to Enjoy One in the Neighborhood



Did you know that the Caesar Salad was invented in Tijuana, Mexico? The "Caesar" responsible for this crisp and savory creation was Caesar Cardini, an Italian chef who owned a restaurant in Tijuana and created this salad in the 1920s to please an unexpected influx of American customers in his restaurant using the supplies he had on hand. And this legendary salad creator has a local connection; some of his descendants still live in the Houston area.

The classic Caesar salad, as designed by Chef Cardini, contains eleven ingredients: grated parmesan cheese, Worcestershire sauce, fresh lime juice, egg, toasted baguette for croutons, anchovy paste, garlic, olive oil, salt, black pepper, and of course, romaine lettuce.

Garden Oaks and the surrounding area offer many choices if you're in the mood for a Caesar salad. The tableside Caesar salad at Cavatore Italian Restaurant on Ella Boulevard is a local legend, and many longtime residents have experienced Cavatore's old school presentation, in which a server rolls out a cart and prepares the salad right in the dining room. Plonk! Bistro and Wine Cellar on West 43rd Street serves their version of a Caesar during the spring, when baby romaine is available from organic grower Animal Farm, which is located just outside of town in Cat Spring, Texas. Plonk! owner Scott Miller learned the original method for making a Caesar salad from the Cardini family, and Plonk! puts its own spin on the classic preparation with a 63-degree sous vide egg and whole leaves of locally grown baby romaine. This classic salad was paired with a Spanish white wine during Plonk!'s recent three-week celebration of Spain.

Whether you choose one of the many delicious Caesar salad options from our local neighborhood restaurants or make one yourself from the traditional eleven ingredients, spring is the perfect time to enjoy this classic salad!

Attendees can participate in a scavenger hunt, collect pollinator trading cards, and see close-up demonstrations of a few of these essential insects.

her other passion is pollinators. Over the past 10 years she has transformed her yard into a certified wildlife and butterfly habitat that she named St. Julians Crossing. This was the beginning of her mission to educate and conserve pollinators and the wildscapes that support them. The event will feature a Pollinator show and tell, guided expeditions for young naturalists, and other enlightening events in the spectacular wildflower setting of the Art Park. Pick up a packet of native seeds and plants that will be distributed, clear a small space in your yard, and take advantage of the useful tips on the St. Julians' website to create your own pollinator paradise.

The meeting was adjourned at 8:30 PM.









Understanding Air Filters

Air filters come in three categories: (1) the type made with paper or fibrous material, (2) the electrostatic kind and (3) the electronic filters.

(1) Paper/fibrous material air filters

These are the filters that are most familiar, constructed of heavyweight paper with fiberglass interiors and found at big box hardware stores. On the low end they cost about \$1.00 each, and are only good for collecting large particles such as pet hair.

The mid-range ones cost around \$3.00 apiece. Some have loose - not tight – pleating - and are great at collecting a variety of contaminates including dust, pollen, spores, pet hair and dander, etc. These are the ones I recommend.

The most expensive is not always the best. There are some fibrous filters on the market which have thick, very tightly pleated media and cost about \$17.00 each. Stay away from these filters! Proper air flow is absolutely essential for your A/C system. Thick media restricts air flow which can cause

all sorts of problems: diminished efficiency, higher utility bills and shortened compressor lifespan.

(2) Electrostatic air filters

These are commonly found in both free-standing room units or in ones incorporated within a central air conditioning system. They are one-inch thick, washable air filters. Yes, you can wash them but they will never become completely clean of debris. I do not recommend these either.

(3) Electronic air filters

In electronic filtering, the particles receive a physical charge and are removed by being attracted to the opposite charge within a contained system. The collected dust and particles must still be removed, and some designs include canisters which are emptied and cleaned. This can be done when your service technician performs Spring and Fall A/C checkups.
